INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths) for the calendar year 1956 and the estimated population for the State of Washington as of July 1, 1956. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Appendix tables contain selected morbidity data, marriage and divorce data for the calendar year 1956.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1950 are available in un-published form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.





NATURAL INCREASE 1915 - 1956




BIRTH AND DEATH RATES 1915 - 1956
PER 1,000 POPULATION




INFANT AND FETAL DEATH RATES, 1915 - 1956

NATALITY


Livebirths

The number of livebirths in Washington in 1956 was the largest in the state's history with 66,185 births occurring in the state and 64,999 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1956 is 24.5, slightly above the ten year median of 24.4.

Table 1 lists the number of births from 1915 through 1956 with rates per 1,000 estimated population. These data are presented graphically on pages 2 and 3. It can be observed in general the trend has been upward although a temporary downward trend prevailed during the period from 1920 through 1933. In 1933, the low rate of 12.9 per 1,000 population prevailed. From this point, a gradual rising trend is observed which continues until the peak is reached in 1947. From 1947 to date, the birth rate seems to have tapered off to a norm of around 24 livebirths per 1,000 estimated population.

Counties showing the highest resident birth rates for 1956 (all those over 30.0 per 1,000 population) were Grant 36.8 per 1,000, Island with 33.4 per 1,000. Those counties showing the lowest resident birth rates (all those under 20.0 per 1,000 population) were Columbia with 18.4 per 1,000; Pacific with 19.1 per 1,000; Wahkiakum with 16.4 per 1,000; Walla Walla with 18.2 per 1,000 and San Juan with 11.6 livebirths per 1,000 population. Residence and occurrence births for 1956

with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 12 of this summary.




Of the total residence livebirths 94.9 per cent were classified as White with 2.3 per cent as Negro, 1.4 per cent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This seems to indicate a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths in this state. County data by race are given in Table 5 on page 14.

Of the livebirths by residence 99.3 per cent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Residence and occurrence data by place, institutions of birth, are given in Table 7 page 18.

The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 105.3 males per every 100 females. In regard to the order of birth more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 27.1% were the first child in the family, 26.0% the second child and 21.2% the third child born to the family. The order of the child in the family is illustrated in the graph on the preceding page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 10.

A total of 667 sets of twins were born in 1956. Of these, 636 sets of twins were born in which both were live born and 31 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.



In addition, to these three sets of triplets were born. All infants in this group were live born. The county and city break-down of multiple births is given in Table 9 page 22. Median age of mothers from 1956 was unchanged at 26 years of age. This in spite of the fact that the greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 22.0 per 1,000 resident livebirths and of occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 22.6 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 9, page 22 contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and of occurrence.

Male infants tended to weigh more at birth than female infants. Median weight of the males was 7 pounds 8 ounces as compared to 7 pounds 3 ounces for the female livebirths. The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 5 1/2 pounds or less at birth, there were 4,405 immature live births or 6.8 per cent of the total number of residence livebirths. This indicates a slight decline from the previous year. Table 9, 10 and 11 on pages 22, 24 and 26 give the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 10 through 29 contain other data on live births for Washington during the year 1956.

Fetal Deaths (Stillbirths)

A total of 777 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1956 or a ratio of 12.0 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1956, 799 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington or a ratio of 12.1 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These figures indicate a slight decline over the previous year. For purposes of Washington state vital statistics registration, the fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life.

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 39.4 per cent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 15 on page 33 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 106.1 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratio per 1,000 livebirths are given in Table 13 on page 30.

MORTALITY

General

There were 24,207 deaths of Washington residents in 1956, a rate of 3.1 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.2 per 1,000 estimated population for a total number of deaths occurring of 24,460. Lewis County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 12.0 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Benton County with the rate of 4.3 per 1,000 population.


The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1956 was 150.1 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths 53.6 per cent were married at the time of death and only 17.6 were widowers. Female deaths included 35.2 per cent married women and 47.2 per cent widowed. Median age of males dying was 68 and the median age at death of females was 71. The white race accounted for 96.8 per cent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary tables 16, 17 and 18, pages 37 through 43 and tables 19 through 31 by contained county and city data.

Selected Causes

Table 17, page 39 gives selected causes of death for all ages arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary table also lists the 16 leading causes of death according to rank.

by Cause



Diseases of the heart accounted for 39.0 per cent of the total number of deaths of Washington residents in 1956 with a rate of 355.8 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918. Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before that time but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under one year. Table 18, page 41 lists the leading causes of death in each 5 year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.


Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 24, pages 54 to 61. Deaths from Motor Vehicle accidents are included in the category "All Accidents", but are also given by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence of the deaths in Table 25, page 60.

Homicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 25, page 60. Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases except tuberculosis are given in Table 26, page 62. Tuberculosis deaths are given in Table 25, page 60.

There were 13 maternal deaths in Washington in 1956. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 27, pages 64 and 65.

Infant Deaths

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under 1 year of age) accounted for 6.3 per cent of the total number of deaths in 1956. The infant death rate was 23.4 per 1,000 livebirths by residence. As can be seen in the graph, page 4, the infant mortality has experienced a steady decline since 1910. Indians again showed the highest infant death rate 51.9 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph at the left shows 1956 infant death rates by race. Table 28, page 66, gives infant deaths by county and city of residence and of occurrence with rates per 1,000 livebirths.



Of residence infant deaths in 1956, there was a ratio of 138.3 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1955, this ratio was 149.6 males to every 100 females.

(Cont'd)

This represents a male infant death rate for 1956 of 26.5 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 20.2 per 1,000 female livebirths.

The largest percentage (62.1%) of infant deaths occurred under International List group 760 to 776, "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for the greatest number of deaths. Immaturity or some other condition with mention of immaturity accounted for 44.9 per cent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 15.0% of the infant deaths followed by influenza which caused 8.9 per cent of the infant deaths and pneumonia (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in category "Certain disease of early infancy") and 3.2 per cent dying from accidents.

Table 29, page 68, gives a detailed breakdown of infant deaths by cause, sex and age of infant. Table 30, page 71 lists the leading causes for the counties and major cities.

Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 76.1 of the total resident infant deaths for 1956. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Table 28, page 66.
