Purpose: WAC 246-322-025 Private psychiatric hospitals - responsibilities and rights - licensee and department. The
Department of Health (department) is adopting a severity matrix for civil fines related to private psychiatric hospital
enforcement in order to implement Substitute House Bill (SHB) 2426 (chapter 115, laws of 2020). SHB 2426 allows the
department, under RCW 43.70.095, to assess a civil fine of up to \$10,000 per violation, not to exceed a total fine of one
million dollars, on a licensed hospital, when the department determines the psychiatric hospital has previously been subject
to an enforcement action for the same or similar type of violation of the same statute or rule, or has been given any previous
statement of deficiency that included the same or similar type of violation of the same or similar statute or rule, or when the
psychiatric hospital has failed to correct noncompliance with a statute or rule by a date established or agreed to by the
department. The rule establishes when and how fines will be assessed in relation to the severity and scope of the violation of
noncompliance.

## PERMANENT RULE (Including Expedited Rule Making)

Adopted under notice filed as WSR 21-21-106 on 10/19/2021 (date).

Describe any changes other than editing from proposed to adopted version: The following changes were made to the proposed rule upon adoption, as a result of suggestions received during the public comment period as well as additional internal review.

- In subsection (6)(b), Table 1, the maximum fine amount for high-severity, limited violations was changed from \$10,000 to \$8,000.
- In subsection (6)(b), Table 1, the maximum fine amount for high-severity, pattern violations was changed from \$10,000 to \$9,000.
- Added subsection (6)(f), which states: "When determining the scope of the violation, the department will also consider the duration of time that has passed between violations that relate to the same or similar circumstances.
- In subsection (6)(a)(i), removed the words "or similar" prior to "statute or rule."
- In subsections (6)(e)(i), (6)(e)(ii) and (6)(e)(iii), added the coordinating conjunction "or" between the words "visitors" and "staff" in the first sentence.
