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## Nursing Commission suspends Okanogan County nurse's license after murder charge

**OLYMPIA** – The Nursing Care Quality Assurance Commission suspended the license of registered nurse Roy Parker Rasmussen, III (RN.00141712) pending further legal action.

Rasmussen has been charged in Okanogan County Superior Court with first-degree murder for the April 16 killing of his former domestic partner. Rasmussen is being held in Okanogan County jail on \$1.5 million bail.

Rasmussen cannot work as a registered nurse in Washington until the department's charges are resolved. He has 20 days to respond to the charges and the suspension.
