## **Applicants, Project Descriptions, Estimated Costs:**

The following six applicants are proposing to provide Medicare and Medicaid-certified hospice services the residents of Pierce County.

- <u>The Pennant Group / Puget Sound Hospice:</u> providing services from an office in Tacoma, with estimated capital costs of \$5,000.
- <u>AccentCare/Seasons Hospice & Palliative Care:</u> providing services from an office in Tacoma, with estimated capital costs of \$96,828.
- <u>Providence Health & Services-Washington:</u> providing services from an office in King County, with estimated capital costs of \$0.
- <u>Bristol Hospice-Pierce:</u> providing services from an office in Thurston County, with estimated capital costs of \$30,000.
- <u>Continuum Care of Snohomish County:</u> providing services from an office in Snohomish County, with estimated capital costs of \$0.
- Wesley Homes Hospice, LLC: providing services from an office in King County, with estimated capital costs of \$0.
