
#### What should you do to prepare for your ICAR?

- It is helpful to invite your Lead Dental Assistant, Infection Prevention Coordinator, or whomever is in charge of the Infection Prevention Program in your clinic.
- Be prepared to share any questions or concerns about infection prevention resources, vaccinations, respirator fit-testing, or state and federal guidance and initiatives.
- Please know the current status of your respiratory protection plan and any PPE shortages in your facility.
- Be prepared for an infection preventionist to tour your sterile processing area





## What can you expect after your ICAR is completed?

Our staff will email you promptly with the following items:



- The ICAR Consultation Summary Report outlining your best practices and areas for improvement
- · Recommendations and resources to address areas for improvement
- Resources such as signage for infection prevention practices
- · Certificate of ICAR participation and window cling
