



Proposed Vancouver opioid treatment program public hearing notice: Washington State Department of Health asking for public input.

The purpose of the hearing is for the public to provide comments about the proposed program as part of the licensing process required in state law. This is not an educational event or question-and-answer session.

In response to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) public health emergency, the department will not provide a physical location for this hearing to promote social distancing and the safety of the citizens of Washington State. Instead, the department will hold a virtual public hearing, without a physical meeting space.

WHO: Clark County Jail North Star Clinic proposes establishing an opioid treatment program at 707 W 13th Street, Vancouver, Washington 98660.

WHAT: Opportunity for the public to comment on the proposed opioid treatment program. This public hearing is free and open to the public. Those who cannot join the webinar can submit comments using one of the options below.
