 - Removing the reference to AIDS education from WAC 246-811-300, as the statutory authority for that requirement was repealed by HB 1551 in 2020;
 - Adding pharmacists as a profession eligible for the alternative path in WAC 246-811-076, which allows members of listed healthcare professions to become credentialed after completing limited SUD-specific education and experience; and
 - Removing from WAC 246-811-070 the requirement that the department verify the coursework of nationally certified applicants, as verifying coursework presents a significant and re-occurring barrier for providers coming from other states.
