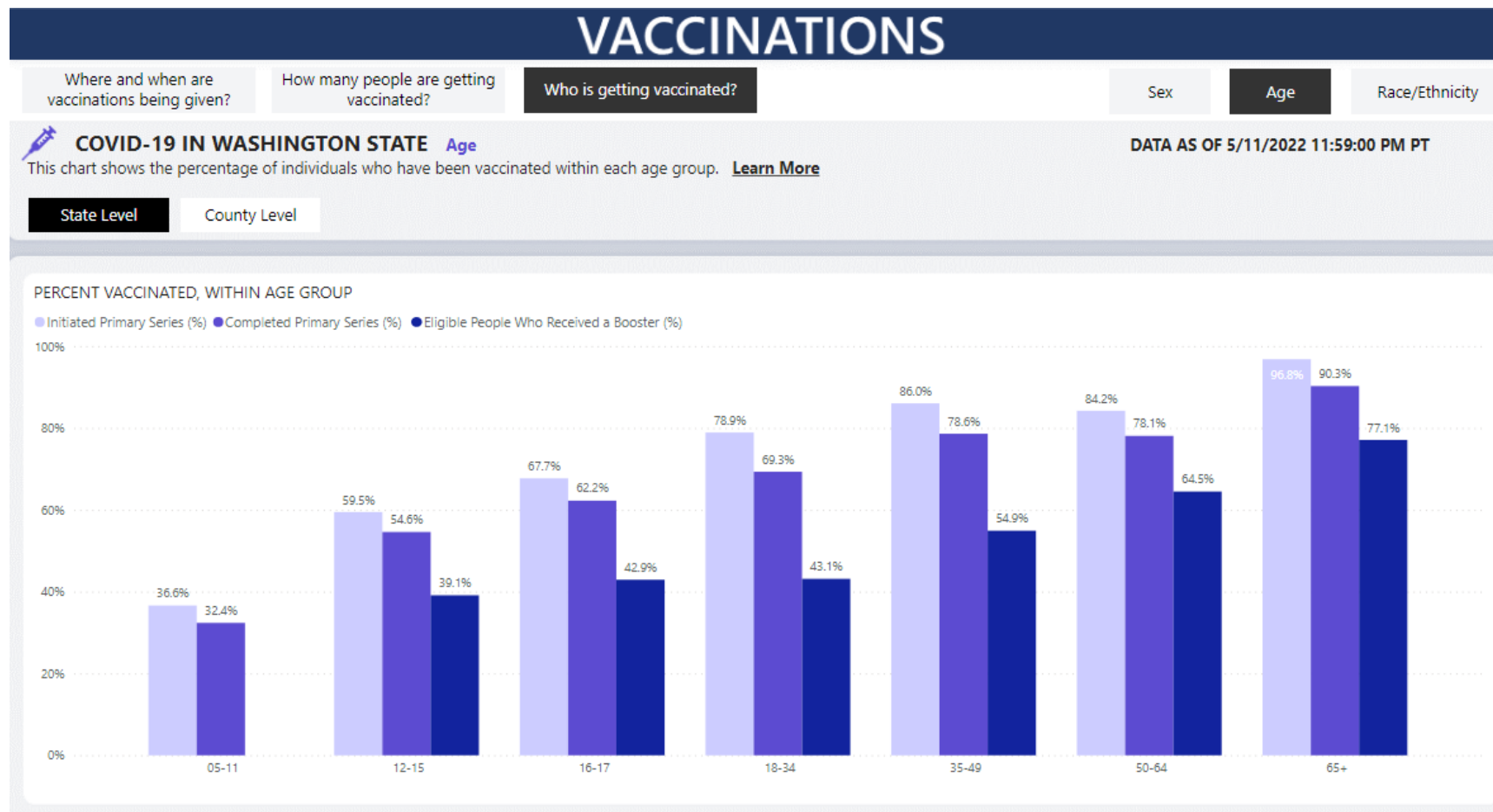

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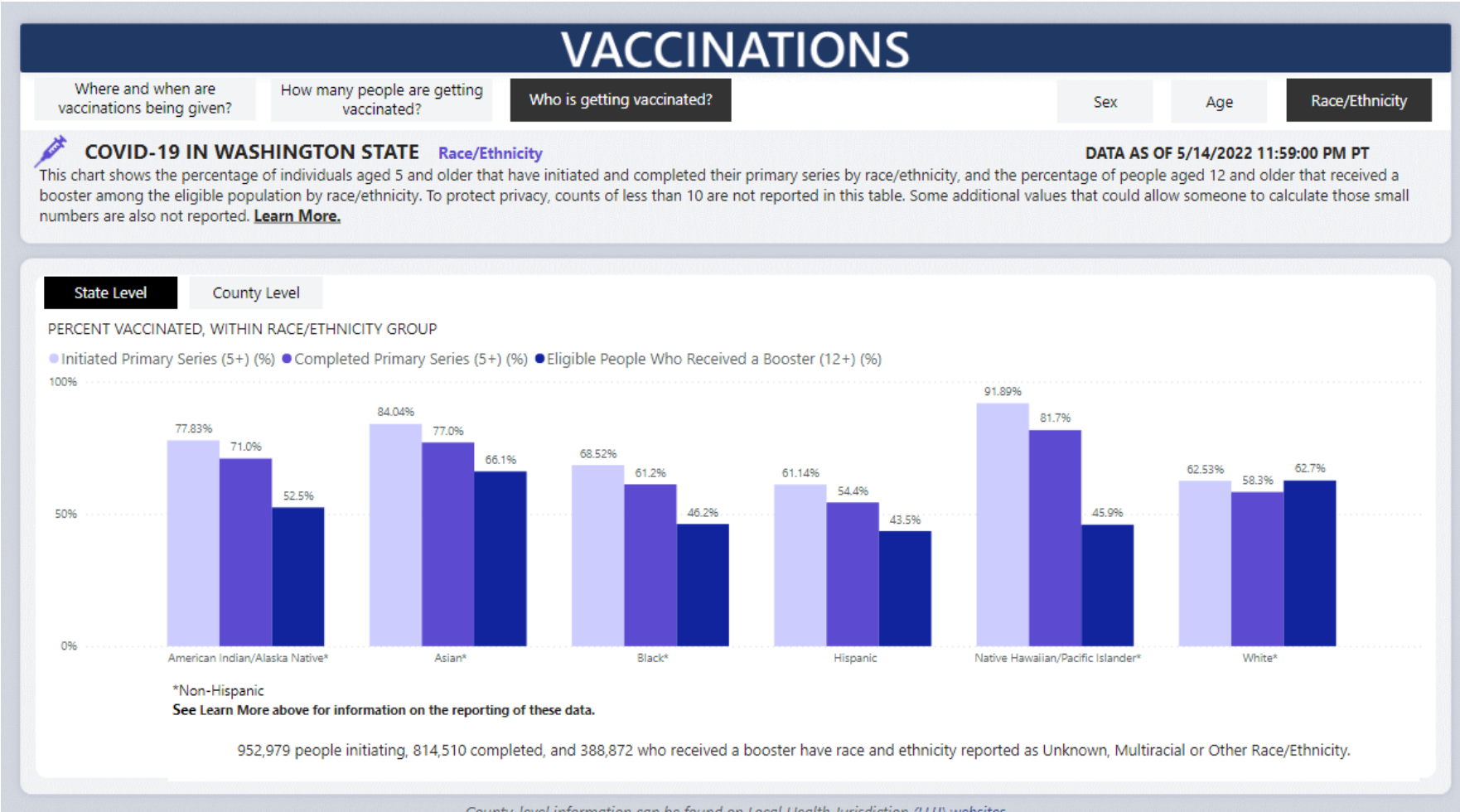

**Coexisting with COVID-19**

How can we do that? By using all the tools we've got: getting vaccinated and boosted, getting tested and staying home if sick or exposed, wearing a mask in crowds, and keeping our distance.

### Masks

Wearing a mask helps to slow the spread of COVID-19. Masks are still required in some settings, so always have one on hand just in case.

Vắc-xin ngừa COVID-19 miễn phí và có sẵn dành cho tất cả mọi người từ 5 tuổi trở lên, bất kể tình trạng nhập cư.

Chúng tôi muốn cung cấp cho quý vị các thông tin quý vị cần biết. Chúng tôi sẽ luôn cập nhật thông tin để quý vị có thể đưa ra quyết định có hiểu biết về sức khỏe của mình.

Ngày 29 tháng 3 năm 2022 - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC, Trung Tâm Kiểm Soát và Phòng Ngừa Dịch Bệnh) đã cập nhật các khuyến nghị của mình để cho phép một số người bị suy giảm miễn dịch và người trên 50 tuổi đã nhận liều tăng cường ban đầu ít nhất 4 tháng trước sẽ đủ điều kiện nhận một liều tăng cường mRNA khác nhằm tăng khả năng bảo vệ để không bị trở nặng khi mắc COVID-19. 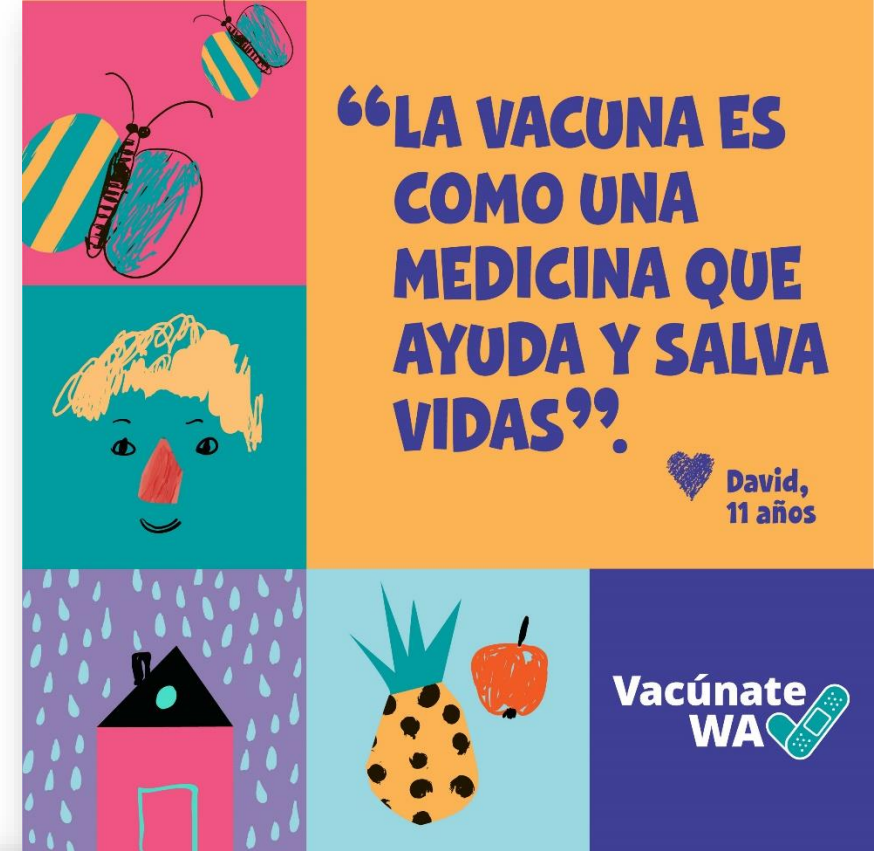
# Kids as Spokespeople

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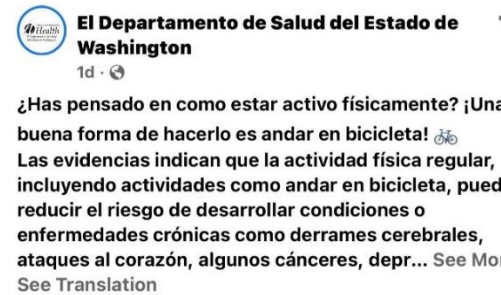

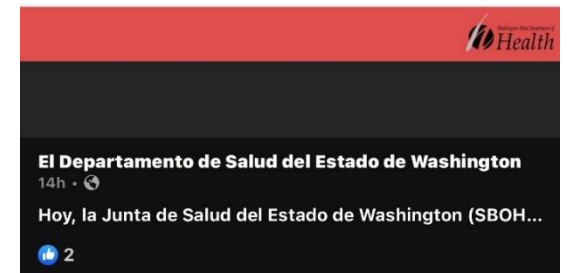


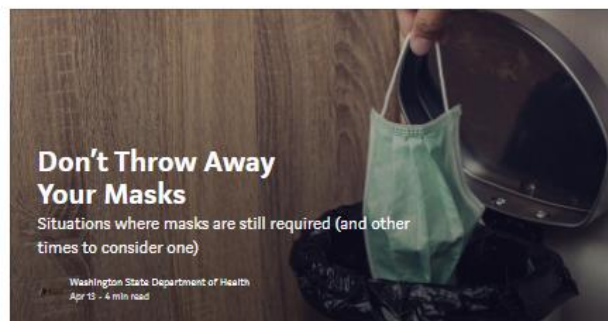

## Booster Doses

- Everyone 12 and older should receive a booster dose of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna)
- Boosters are the best tool we have to fight the virus. We know COVID-19 vaccines prevent severe illness, hospitalization, and death.
- Boosters will help ensure longer-lasting immunity and increase any waning protection.
- People 50 and older and certain individuals 12 and older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised can receive a second booster dose four months after receiving their first booster dose

The [Care-a-Van](#) serves communities disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 and allows community organizations to request and lead a COVID vaccination event.

# Care-A-Van Request Process

## Care-a-Van



The Washington State Department of Health (DOH) is launching a new mobile COVID-19 vaccination effort across Washington state. We will work closely with community partners and local health jurisdictions to increase access to vaccine for priority communities. To submit a request to have a DOH Care-a-Van at your event, please fill out the form below and someone will reach out to you within 5 business days from the date of submission.

To maximize scheduling efforts, we ask that you submit your requests 30 days in advance of the event. Submission of request does not guarantee attendance but is based on availability.

Community-based organizations with nonprofit 501c3 status, fiscal sponsorship, or state- and federally recognized tribes may be eligible for a small grant from All In Washington of up to \$5,000. Organizations that focus on Black, Indigenous or People of Color will be prioritized. Grant funds can be used to support staffing, outreach, operational, or other expenses related to a Care-A-Van event. To be considered for this funding, complete the form section related to the All in Washington grant.

1. Request comes in through DOH portal
2. Request information is shared with LHJ
3. LHJ notifies DOH if they prefer to fulfill the request\*
4. If the Care-A-Van will be used, then a planning meeting is set up with the requestor and details are discussed:
  - Facility layout
  - Event logistics
  - Marketing & promotion
  - Equity & access needs
6. LHJ will be notified after the event with information about number and types of doses administered

**Note:** Requests may also be supported by a DOH contractor or the Washington State Pharmacy Association, depending on the request or scheduling constraints

# Care Connect

*“Is there any reason you will not be able to be to quarantine and/or isolate until you receive your test results?”*

## Care Connect:

- Provides individuals and families with food and care kits or housing assistance while they are isolation and quarantine.
- Program has **helped more than 100,000 people to date** so they could remain home to take care of their health and protect their communities.





# “Say Yes! Covid Test”

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- “Say Yes! Covid Test”
  - DOH is offering free, rapid, at-home COVID-19 test kits to residents of eligible communities. Test kit includes complete instructions and Digital Assistant offers guidance through the whole process.
  - Almost 3 million at-home test kits across Washington through the portal, often delivered overnight, in partnership with Amazon and Care Evolution.

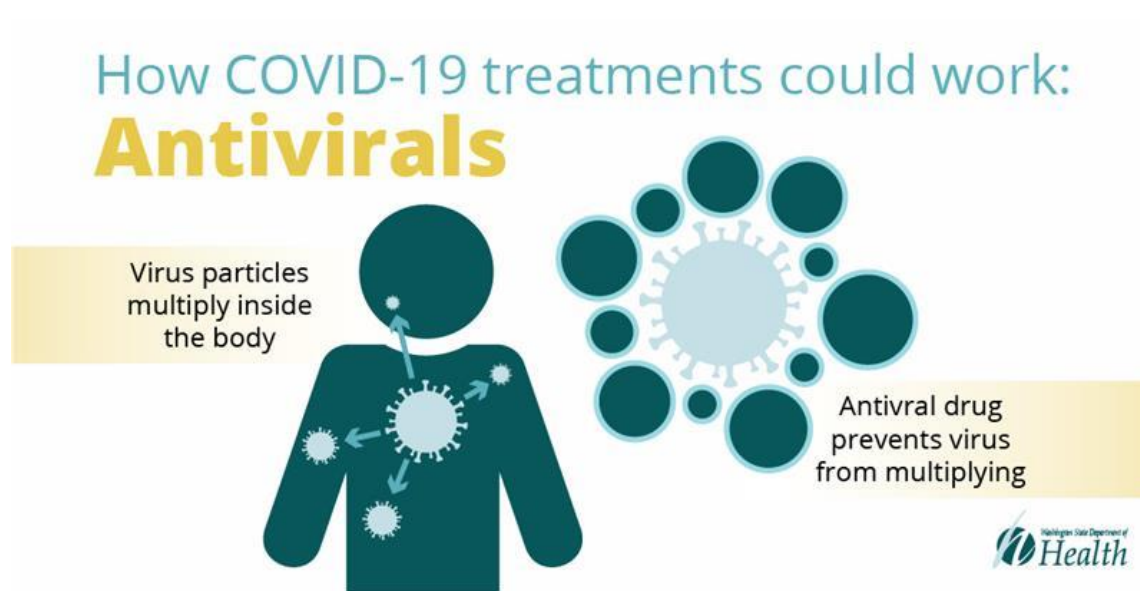


# COVID-19 Therapeutics

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The [Test to Treat](#) program can provide faster, easier access to lifesaving COVID-19 treatments. If you test positive, you can see a health care provider, and if eligible, get a prescription for an oral COVID-19 treatment and have that prescription filled—all at one location.

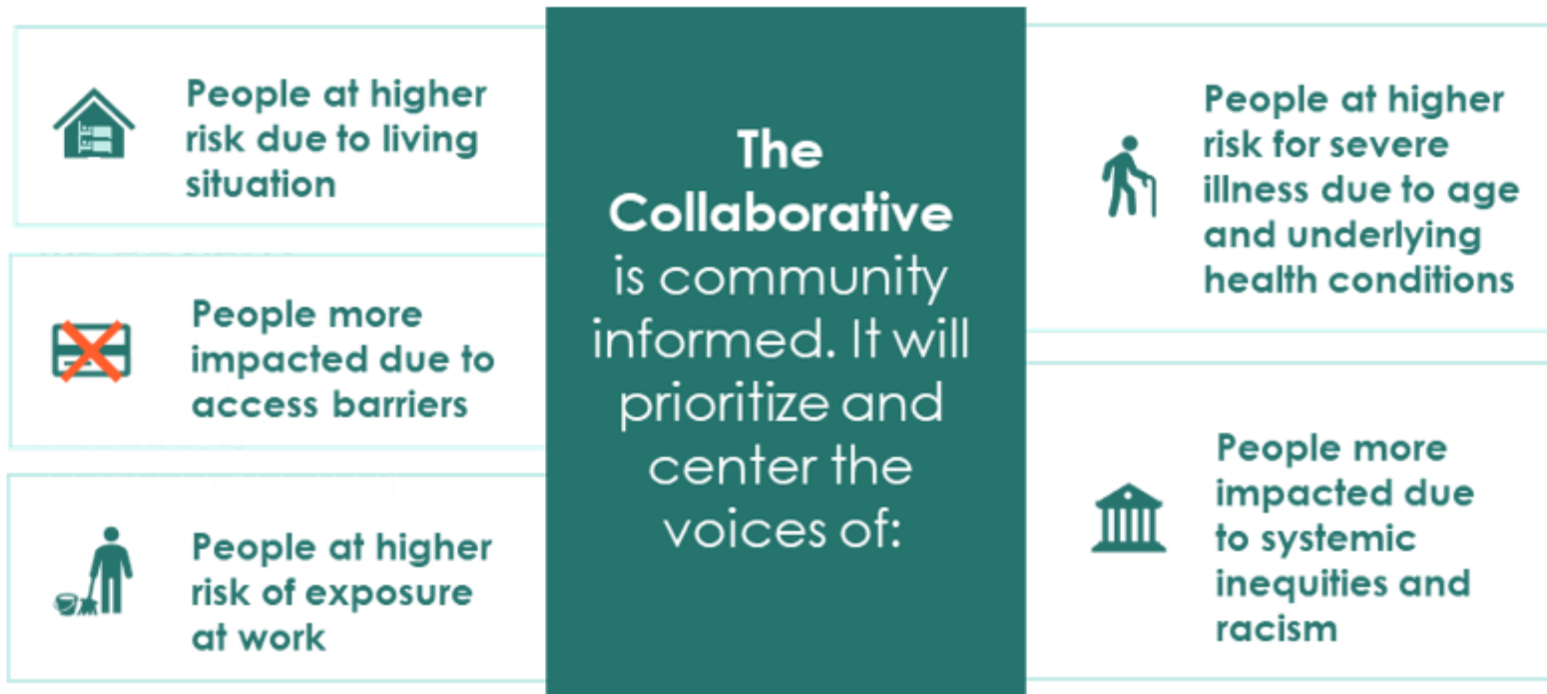

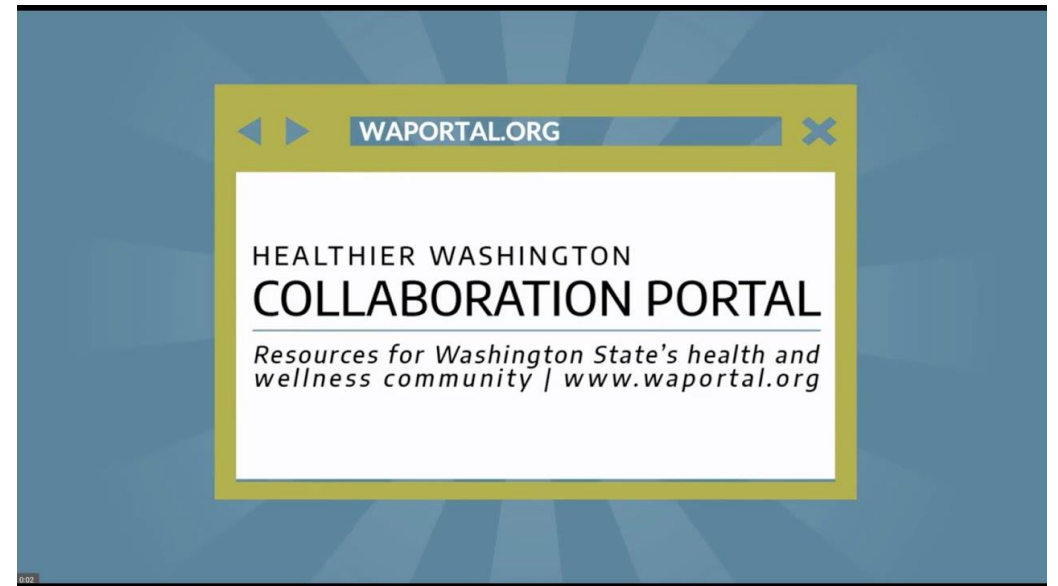

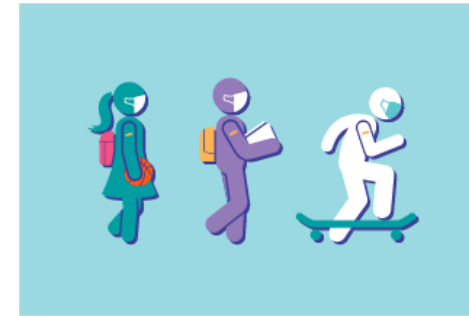
