



2023 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Lead Service Line (LSL) Loan Overview

331-715 • 3/1/2023

Application Cycle: April 1 to April 28. On-line application in Washington Loan Tracking network (WALT) is available for application submittal. Refer to our [WALT External User's Guide 331-614 \(PDF\)](#).

Amount available to award: Approximately \$126 million in loans including the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding.

Minimum award: \$25,000 per jurisdiction.

Eligible entities: Group A community water systems (publicly owned, privately owned, and for-profit), Group A nonprofit non-community water systems and tribal-owned community not-for-profit systems not receiving other SRF funding for the project.

Non-eligible entities: Federal and state owned systems (however, these systems can be part of a consolidation project), Group A for-profit non-community water systems, and Group B water systems.

Lead Service Line Inventory Projects

LSL Inventory Loan Information: 2.0 percent service fee, 0.0 percent interest rate for ten-year standard loan term. Inventories are due to us by October 16, 2024.

Eligible projects: LSL Inventory Projects: All work towards creation of the lead service line inventory including file record review, customer surveys, and potholing.

Eligibility requirements for LSL Inventory: Water systems without a current, approved planning document (Water System Plan or Small Water System Management Program) must include development or update of the planning document in the scope of work. [EZ1 Project Review Form 331-651 \(Word\)](#) is required for inventories including potholing in the scope of work.

Scoring and ranking of LSL Inventory Applications: We will rank all inventory projects on a first come, first served basis according to the day stamp in WALT. In the event of a tie, we will select the project with the lower full time residential population shown in DOH Sentry database.

Lead Service Line Replacement Projects

LSL Replacement Loan information: 2.0 percent service fee, 2.25 percent standard interest rate for ten-year standard loan term.

Eligible projects: LSL Replacement Projects: Replacement of lead or galvanized service lines from the main line connection to the building. Service meter installations or replacements are not eligible for funding.

Eligibility requirements for LSL Replacements: Must have current, approved planning document that is current through April 28, 2023. Also, must have legal control of the project site such as an agreement or construction easement signed by the property owner for construction work to be allowed. All funded LSL replacement projects must be reviewed and approved by the regional engineer prior to proceeding to construction.

Scoring and ranking of LSLS Replacement Applications: We score and rank all projects based on readiness to proceed to construction. We award funds to highest ranking projects until funding is exhausted. Similarly, we award subsidy to highest ranking projects until subsidy is exhausted. Not all projects eligible for subsidy will receive subsidy.

Application review process: All applications reviewed for completeness and eligibility in May. If the application is incomplete, we will notify you and you will have 14 calendar days to provide any missing information. Applicants will be notified in June regarding their funding status. If funded, we will generate loan agreements late summer to early autumn.
