Subject of possible rule making:

WAC 246-254-053, Radiation machine facility fees. The Department of Health (department) is considering amending registration and tube fees to cover operating costs. This may include updating or restructuring existing fees or creating new fees.

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject:

RCW 43.70.110 and 43.70.250

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish:

Per RCW 43.70.250, the Secretary of Health (secretary) shall from time to time establish the amount of all application fees, license fees, registration fees, examination fees, permit fees, renewal fees, and any other fee associated with licensing or regulation of professions, occupations, or businesses (licensees) administered by the Department of Health (department). Any and all fees or assessments, or both, levied on the state to cover the costs of the operations and activities shall be borne by the persons who hold licenses. In fixing said fees, the secretary shall set the fees for each program at a sufficient level to defray the costs of administering that program.

The department has completed an initial assessment of the radiation machine program fiscal resources and determined the program is not generating sufficient revenue to cover the cost of the program over the fiscal planning period. The program is also reviewing machine categories to better align with current classifications and may update or restructure existing fees and may propose new fees for radiation machine facilities. This rulemaking will not alter or change any professional license fees that radiation professionals currently pay (e.g., radiation technician, radiation technologist). This fee rule applies to facilities that pay registration fees for radiation machine facilities and tube fees for radiation machines.
