



## **Helping Health Care Providers Address Patient Exposures to PFAS**

Health care providers (physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses) may not be familiar with the topic of exposure to environmental chemicals – including PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) – and patient health.
