



Independent Living (IL) Movement

- Led by people with disabilities who sought to create a society that would be more accessible, inclusive, and empowering for people with disabilities.
- This means having access to the same opportunities, rights, and freedoms as nondisabled people, such as education, employment, housing, transportation, healthcare, and social participation.
 - Self-determination and peer support.
 - Personal assistance services and other accommodations that allow people with disabilities to live in the community.
- Centers for Independent Living (CILs)
 - Community-based organizations run by and for people with disabilities.
- Helped to shift the focus from a medical model of disability to a social model.

End of the Federal Public Health Emergency

What may be impacted?

- Medical coverage for vaccine services
- Federal funding
- Medicaid, Medicare, and CHIP programs

What will not be impacted?

- Emergency Use Authorizations (EUAs)
- PREP Act
- Federally supplied vaccines

Current COVID-19 Vaccines

Four COVID-19 vaccines are approved or authorized in the United States:

- Pfizer-BioNTech
- Moderna
- Novavax
- Johnson & Johnson's Janssen (J&J/Janssen) (CDC recommends that the J&J/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine only be <u>considered in</u> <u>certain situations</u>, due to safety concerns.)

COVID-19 Vaccine Commercialization

- Commercialization is the process of bringing COVID-19 vaccines to the open market for purchase.
- The federal government has not released a timeline for commercialization, but we anticipate that it will take place in late summer or early fall of 2023.
- The US Government is currently the sole purchaser of COVID-19 vaccines. Commercialization will allow providers to privately purchase vaccines for their patients or enroll in our <u>Childhood Vaccine Program</u> and/or <u>Adult Vaccine Program</u>.

The Goal

Implement and sustain *a system* to support people in isolation and quarantine due to illness and/or exposure to COVID-19; reduce community transmission; and support their physical, social and emotional needs during their period of isolation and quarantine.

Services

- Care Kits
- Food Kits
- Fresh Food Delivery
- Household Assistance- Rent/Mortgage and Utilities
- Client specific interventions- Medication delivery, referrals to outside agencies

- A need for assistance



Image description: Map of Washington State counties and Care Connect Hubs, color-coded by Care Connect region.



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
