Hello,

As agreed, please consider this e-mail a follow up to our technical assistance (TA) meeting yesterday. It should also be considered the response to the current DOR #23-18 submitted by Community Home Health and Hospice.

As I understand our discussion, Community Home Health and Hospice currently operates two separate hospice care centers.

One located in Clark County, and one located in Cowlitz County.

The TA focused on a change in ownership of the Cowlitz County hospice care center [license #00000262]. The new owners would be PeaceHealth.

PeaceHealth currently operates a Medicare and Medicaid approved hospice agency [license #60331226] and is approved to serve Clark, Cowlitz, Skamania, and Wahkiakum counties.

PeaceHealth also operates a hospice care center in Clark County. The newly purchased hospice care center in Cowlitz County would be licensed under this agency.

Community Home Health and Hospice's Clark County hospice care will close and be removed from the agency's license.

Based on the above information, the proposed change in ownership does not require Certificate of Need review. If you have any follow up questions as you proceed with the change of ownership of the Cowlitz County hospice care center or the closure of the Clark County facility, please let me know.
