What is PrEP?

To be eligible for PrEP DAP, you must:

- Live in Washington State

If you need assistance, you can contact a prevention navigation agency listed on the back, or our eligibility staff with the DOH PrEP DAP program.



Only you and a medical provider can decide if PrEP is right for you.

Generally, PrEP is for anyone that is at an increased risk for contracting HIV. This includes anyone who is in an ongoing relationship with a person living with HIV, anyone who does not consistently use a condom, and anyone who shares injection drug or hormone equipment.

What is PrEP DAP?

PrEP DAP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis Drug Assistance Program) is an assistance program created for people living in Washington State who are HIV-negative, at risk of contracting HIV, and who are prescribed PrEP. PrEP DAP pays the enrollees portion of allowed **PrEP**-

- related costs.

 Medical & Lab Visits
- Medications Including generic PrEP, STI Treatment, and Vaccines

PrEP, short for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis, is a medication that prevents HIV and promotes sexual health.

PrEP is for anyone – straight, gay, or bisexual, male, female, transgender, or gender non-conforming individuals.

PrEP is for people who are HIV not living with HIV (HIV Negative).

PrEP, Condoms, and STIs

PrEP does not protect you from sexually transmitted infections (STIs) like syphilis, gonorrhea, or chlamydia. Using PrEP and condoms together gives you protection from both HIV and most STIs. While taking PrEP, you should get tested periodically for STIs. Early diagnosis and treatment protects your health and prevents passing STIs to sexual partners.
