## Dear Tribal Leader:

I am writing today to provide information about a rulemaking that the Department of Health (department) is considering initiating for chapter 246-296 WAC- Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Loan Program to implement requirements of the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) which provides additional funding for eligible infrastructure projects.

The DWSRF Loan Program is a federal program that provides low-interest loans to help eligible public water systems build, repair, and redesign infrastructure. The DWSRF program's public health protection goals are to support public water systems to provide safe and reliable drinking water to their customers by addressing problems such as replacing aging infrastructure, installing treatment to remove contaminants, restructuring failing water systems, and responding to public health emergency events. Tribal entities are eligible to receive DWSRF money for drinking water infrastructure projects provided the proposed project has not received assistance from the national set-aside for Indian Tribes.

The Department of Health (department) has recently adopted two emergency rules, WSR 23-05-069, February 17, 2023, and WSR 23-06-064, February 27, 2023, to implement requirements under BIL by amending the definition of disadvantaged community, amending loan terms to allow for partial or full loan forgiveness, removing the requirement for a current water system plan or small water system management program for loans for lead service line identification and replacement and remediating emerging contaminants, and making amendments to the project priority rating and ranking criteria. The department is evaluating these changes and will consider permanently adopting these amendments to conform to BIL requirements.
