Responsibilities as a member of the Steering Committee:

- 1. Consistent attendance as outlined in ARTICLE III, SECTION 8 of the WSPG Charter
- 2. Membership Engagement activities will include but not limited to:
 - manage business for the general WSPG (full steering committee)
 - welcoming new members (full steering committee)
 - reviewing complaints and determining course of action (full steering committee)
 - general meeting agenda planning and approval (full steering committee)

Additional Tri-chair responsibilities:

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- discuss membership activities including attendance (tri-chairs)
- supporting member individual engagement plans (tri-chairs)
- facilitating WSPG general meetings (tri-chairs)
- leading all official votes taken by the WSPG (tri-chairs)
- providing signatures for official documents (tri-chairs)
- 3. Upholding group commitments of member conduct outlined in ARTICLE III, SECTION 10 of the WSPG Charter
 - upholding collaborative social norms
- **4. Note-** DOH (government) tri-chair is not a voting member of the WSPG (Article III, section 4).

STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBERS: ARTICLE VI Steering Committee Section 1. Role

• The WSPG will be managed by the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee will have power to manage the business of the WSPG, including, but not limited to, determining and carrying out the full scope of work for the WSPG and serving as the liaison for the functional committees, and except as otherwise provided herein. The Steering Committee is responsible for approving agenda for WSPG meetings and conducting WSPG business between meetings. The Steering Committee is also responsible for membership management as outlined in ARTICLE III in the CHARTER AND BYLAWS.

The Steering Committee must include:

- One (1) Member representing providers with expertise in and/or people with lived experience in HIV
- One (1) Member representing providers with expertise in and/or people with lived experience in viral hepatitis
- One (1) Member representing providers with expertise in and/or people with lived experience in STIs
- Three (3) Members representing communities of interest/importance
- At least two thirds (2/3) of the members of the Steering Committee must be from Black, Indigenous, Hispanic/Latino/Latina/Latinx, and People of Color Communities.

WSPG members will volunteer to serve as Steering Committee members following selection of the WSPG and self-sorting of WSPG members into Functional Committees. In the case of multiple WSPG members volunteering for the same Steering Committee role, the WSPG Tri-chairs will select the final Steering Committee membership.
