Caucus leads report out (35 Minutes)	 James Tillet shared about Drug User Health Wanted to maintain equity in the room Out of 20 possible participants 4 individuals relocated to WA due to the provision of HIV services 10 were confirmed users 3 had lived experience with all three syndemics Made up of African Americans, From three different counties including Thurston and Snohomish counties Provider accountability was the number one need as was transportation Peer advocacy and support was desired during the appointment to keep the providers balanced JJ Caucus lead from the Transgender/ Gender Expansive Caucus Had 3 transgender men participate Needed mobile access, HIV testing vans are needed for the rural community, where as a brick and mortar didn't allow privacy for appointment seekers 	

- Brigette led the <u>People impacted by mental health diagnosis or cognitive</u> disabilities:
 - Education and resources were in needed
 - Yob Benami: led HIV long-term survivors group pre HAART (1996)
 - In the first listening session, I dealt with what everyone else was dealing with and that was bots but
- I feel it worked out OK for me because the two individuals that I had
 in the session were not as experienced in HIV as they had led on as
 we talked,
- I could see just how much trouble they were going through adjusting.
 We had a really good talk, and I'm glad to say that by the end of the session both were definitely in a better headspace.
 - Provider accountability
 - An app of provider satisfaction
 - Really was able to connect with the participants to really hear their stories
- Questions:
- Beth asked if it is thought that we continue our community conversations work with these defined communities in the currently established caucuses or should we choose new ones?
- There were other caucus subjects, and the caucus leads should reflect the caucuses they represent
- JJ suggested submitting caucus groups based on RFAs received
- William shared about getting more data making sure it was more accurate, and an app would be a great way to capture this information
- A peer network can share the survey and offer solutions to problems posed
- We are offering a round of applause concerning all the wonderful work
 we do. The caucus leads did a wonderful job doing the work. Also
 wanted to give credit to the caucus leads for the work they have done
 with the community conversation caucus groups. It has been shared that
 more questions than that can be answered in this one session. The
