

Bill Overview

Substitute Senate Bill 5189 (2023) established a new profession: Behavioral Health Support Specialist (BHSS)

 Per the bill a BHSS is "a person certified to deliver brief, evidence-based interventions with a scope of practice that includes behavioral health under the supervision of a Washington state credentialed provider who has the ability to assess, diagnose, and treat identifiable mental and behavioral health conditions as part of their scope. A behavioral health support specialist does not have within their scope of practice the ability to make diagnoses but does track and monitor treatment response and outcomes using measurement-based care."

- Must be implemented by January 1, 2025
- Establishing a profession requires:
 - Communication avenues (email, website, etc)
 - Rulemaking
 - Setting fees
 - Creating credentialing process and application packet
 - FAQs



Payment and Billing: Explore sources of revenue







RULES OVERVIEW

What is a Rule?

Rule: a regulation that helps give clarity if the underlying statute is broad or unclear

An enforceable directive that:


- Subjects a person to a penalty or sanction if that person violates a regulation
- Sets qualifications for conveying privileges to people or entities
- Sets procedures or practices for agency hearings
- Licenses or permits individuals or entities and revokes licenses or permits
- Sets project or material standards for goods before they can be sold or distributed in Washington

Laws vs. Rules

Laws	Rules
Revised Code of Washington (RCW)	Washington Administrative Code (WAC)
Enacted by the Legislature and signed by the Governor	Rules must fit with the specific statutory authority
Serve as statutory authority or permission for our rules and activities	Used to implement laws and policies
Chapter 34.05 RCW is the law that tells agencies the process it must follow when adopting rules known as the Administrative Procedures Act (APA).	Title 246 WAC holds all Department of Health and State Board of Health rules and must comply with the APA.

WAC Numbering System

Example from the Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission



- Title: Each agency gets their own title number from the code reviser
 - Department of Health and State Board of Health ightarrow Title 246 WAC
- Chapter: Identifies subject matters regulated under agency's statutes
 - Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission ightarrow Chapter 246-945 WAC
- Section: Each section is considered an individual rule
 - "Nonresident pharmacy license" → WAC 246-945-235

What May Generate Rulemaking?


- New or revised legislation
- Board/Commission or Department of Health (DOH) identifies need
- Formal petitions by interested parties under RCW 34.05.330
- Changes in technology or national standards
- Court decision
- Governor's directives

STANDARD RULEMAKING PROCESS

Standard Rulemaking Process

All phases include:

- Review and approval from DOH staff
- Filing with the Code Reviser (CR) office and issued a Washington State Register (WSR) number
 - Example: WSR 20-10-100
- Notification to interested parties



Standard Rule Process*

CR101	CR102	CR103
• Rulemaking is initiated	 Begin drafting rule language Determine potential costs Public meeting(s) Rules workshop(s) Written comment period Public Hearing (held at least 33 days after the CR102 filing) 	 Rule language finalized Agency adopts rule (effective 31 days after CR103 filing)

*Standard rulemaking may take 12 to 18 months to complete.
