The new WIC Vendor contract period is October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2026.




NEW CANNED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES ADDED



As of October 2, 2023, WIC participants may purchase select canned fruits and vegetables (F & V) with their Cash Value Benefits (CVB). We added over 300 canned F & V and anticipate more will be added as "I couldn't buy this" reports are received through the WICShopper mobile app.

Please work with your POS provider to ensure the Approved Products List (APL) is uploaded frequently, if not nightly. This ensures your POS system will allow WIC products to be purchased each time WIC foods are added or removed. INFANT FORMULA THEFT



Infant formula is a common target for theft due to its high demand and value. Many stores are locking up formula to prevent shoplifters from taking these products. The extra security measures also help stop people from bulk-buying the product, leaving some shelves empty. As a reminder, stores are required to always have nine (9) cans of Similac Advance Powdered Formula 12.4 oz. available for WIC customers.

For these reasons, WIC encourages all stores to keep formula in a secure area. If you decide to place or are currently placing formula in a secure area other than the isle where baby items are found, we suggest putting a sign up for customers of where to locate infant formula.

WIC Vendor Training documentation is a contract requirement that could result in a penalty if not kept and available as requested. Whether some is kept in a folder or online, it must be available to review if requested. Training documentation may include the review of quarterly e-Bulletins, the WIC Annual Training Document, and staff interactive training, for example.

Please keep all WIC training documentation for the current contract period and if a new contract just started, also keep one year of the previous contract period.

Contract Language:

7.1.6 Upon request, make all records related to the WIC Program available for inspection and audit by the Department, USDA Food and Nutrition Services, and the Comptroller General of the United States at any reasonable time and place.

10.1.6 Maintain records identifying when training took place, and which staff were trained, for staff trained by store representatives for the duration of the contract period.

WIC VENDOR MANAGEMENT TEAM

The Washington State WIC Vendor Management Team's goal is to build strong relationships and provide support to stores so they may be successful WIC vendors.



Our three Vendor Management Specialists work directly with 660 authorized WIC stores and their employees, stores interested in becoming WIC vendors, and corporate offices.

We provide technical assistance and education, in person and online interactive vendor training, education buys, routine store monitoring, and provide supplies upon request.

WHO IS WIC ELIGIBLE?

Washington State WIC offers multiple resources to help safeguard and improve the health of mothers and children up to age 5, for a greater opportunity to grow and thrive.

Eligibility depends on household size and income.



- WIC is a nutrition program for pregnant women, new and breastfeeding moms, and children under five.
- Dad, grandparents, and other caregivers of children under the age of five may also sign kids up for WIC.
- Foster children under age five and foster teens who are pregnant are eligible for WIC.
- If a person or family member is on Medicaid, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), or Basic Food they may be eligible for WIC too.
- Many working families and military families are eligible for WIC.



scan to find WIC clinics There are over 200 WIC clinics in Washington State. A person contacts a <u>local WIC clinic</u> for an assessment. If a clinic health worker determines the adult or child meets the nutritional risk criteria, the applicant becomes a participant and receives a customized food prescription benefit.

Food benefits issued to WIC participants are exchanged in authorized WIC stores for nutritious foods high in protein, calcium, iron, or vitamins A & C.
