

OVERVIEW

Overview

Substitute Senate Bill 5189 (2023) established a new profession: Behavioral Health Support Specialist (BHSS)

 Per the bill a BHSS is "a person certified to deliver brief, evidence-based interventions with a scope of practice that includes behavioral health under the supervision of a Washington state credentialed provider who has the ability to assess, diagnose, and treat identifiable mental and behavioral health conditions as part of their scope. A behavioral health support specialist does not have within their scope of practice the ability to make diagnoses but does track and monitor treatment response and outcomes using measurement-based care."

Approximate Timeline for Rulemaking

File a new CR101 – completed July 2023

Rules workshops – Fall 2023 and Spring 2024

File CR102 – Summer 2024

Public Hearing – Fall 2024

File CR103 – November 2024

New BHSS credentials available – January 1, 2025

WORKSHOP - CONTINUING EDUCATION

Requirements in Bill

 20 hours of continuing education (CE) every two years after initial certification for certification renewal

Things to determine:

- Required topics and minimum hours in each topic (ethics, suicide, equity, telehealth etc)
- Documentation
- Types of CE (self study, articles, serving on panel, preparing a CE course etc)
- Acceptable accreditation for those who offer CE courses

Section 2:

Under the definition of a BHSS:

"a person certified to deliver brief, evidence-based interventions with a scope of practice that includes behavioral health under the supervision of a Washington state credentialed provider who has the ability to assess, diagnose, and treat identifiable mental and behavioral health conditions as part of their scope. A behavioral health support specialist does not have within their scope of practice the ability to make diagnoses but does track and monitor treatment response and outcomes using measurement-based care."
