# FUNDING BASICS

### Summary

- Application reopens February 1, 2024
- Applications accepted year-round
- \$50,000 maximum award per project
- May submit multiple applications for different projects
- 100% Grant
- Work cannot begin until grant agreement is signed
- Agreements signed within 6 months of application review
- Complete project within 2 years of signing agreement

### Eligible Entities

- Cities and Towns
- Counties
- Public Utility Districts
- Water/Sewer Districts
- Not-for-profit Organizations including homeowners associations
- Tribal Communities, if not-for-profit
- Approved Satellite Management Agencies

### Eligible Project Activities

- Feasibility Study
- Water System Plan development or update or amendment
- Small Water System Management Program development or update
- Engineering Design
- Connection Fees
- Community Engagement

### Feasibility Study Evaluation Report Requirements

- Compare consolidation versus not consolidating
  - Construction costs for projects needed during next 20 years
  - Operations and maintenance over 20 years
  - Asset inventory
  - Cost of a second source if a single source water system
  - Board evaluation of the system to be acquired
    - Number of board members and rate of vacancy
    - Estimated time each board member spends overseeing the system
    - Board's ability to manage a multi-year infrastructure project and communicate with water users
  - Ability to take on debt
  - Ability to apply for funding and manage funding
  - Manage water rate increases

# REQUIRED ONLINE ACCOUNTS

### Washington Loan Tracker (WALT)

- Must contact Sara Herrera to be registered with WALT water system or water system representative. Each person must be registered who wants access.
- Must have a Secure Access Washington (SAW) account to apply

# System for Award Management or SAM.gov

- Go to SAM.gov you must REGISTER to apply for federal funding
- If new, click Get Started to register your entity.
- If your entity is registered, click Renew Entity. You will need the expiration date.
- If unsure of status, click Check Entity Status.
- Follow instructions in the SAM.gov Video: Get a Unique Entity ID article.
- To watch the video, click on "get your Unique Entity ID".
- It can take 4 weeks to get a Unique Entity Identifier assigned. Required before you sign a contract. **NOT required for the application.**



# Scoring

### Risk Categories

#### **Five Risk Categories**

- Risk Category 1 42 Points address microbial contamination event or microbial compliance issues.
- Risk Category 2 34 Points address primary inorganic chemical contamination exceeding a Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL), Treatment Technique (TT) or Action Level (AL), or State Action Level (SAL).
- Risk Category 3 26 Points address a primary chemical risk, a sanitary survey significant deficiency, install disinfection treatment, lead component or lead service line removal, or exceed an EPA chemical Health Advisory (HA).
- Risk Category 4 18 Points address a secondary MCL, resilience, seawater intrusion risk, a sanitary survey finding, or the system exceeds 75 percent of nitrate or arsenic MCL.
- Risk Category 5 10 Points address infrastructure sustainability.






