The Washington State Department of Health (DOH)'s Workforce Pathways Program will host 15 paid interns at DOH in Summer 2024.

We encourage college and university students interested in working in the field of public health to apply for an internship opportunity!



What does the DOH Workforce Pathways Paid Summer Internship Program provide?

- Professional opportunities for post-secondary students to work with teams of professionals across DOH on a variety of public health topics and issues.
- Internships may involve a range of projects and shadowing opportunities with internal and external public health partners;
- Internship projects may vary depending upon the student's degree level as well as area(s) of interest and skill sets.

Key Details

- 10-week summer internship (mid-June to mid-August 2024)
- Average 35 hours/week
- Hourly wage at roughly \$20 per hour
- Positions are primarily remote (students may live anywhere in Washington State)
- Students must be pursuing a postsecondary degree (at the associates' level to the undergraduate or graduate level)

Benefits of an Internship at DOH

- Exposure to professional work environments in public health
- Opportunity to develop and apply skills in your field(s) of interest
- Networking opportunities with public health professionals


How to apply?
