A 002	General School Data: Review building age, type, <u>use of space</u> , square footage; names of key personnel on site; building floor and site plans as appropriate (e.g.: fire exit routes and/or directional maps which are often given to parents at "open-houseopen house" events). A 003	Demographics: Review enrollment numbers, grade span, etc. (approximate numbers are sufficient).		OSPI and DOH		
A 004	Safety and Health Data: Review general and/or summarized health and safety information and/or injury reports which may be useful in assessing health or safety trends or problems within the school.		OSPI and DOH		
A 005	History: Review previous health agency reports, safety committee reports, inspections, follow-ups, and complaints (if any) and their disposition or other actions taken by the school in response.		OSPI and DOH
