We're seeking committed and passionate people to offer workshops and guide conversations about better brain health and dementia-awareness.

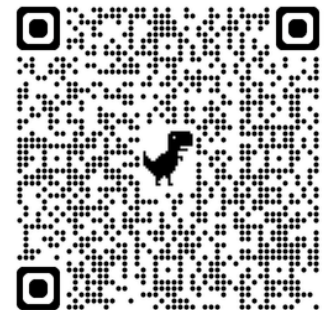
