



Steps to Operate in the Commercial Razor Clam Fishery

Step 1: Determine if you want to start your own operation *OR* will be harvesting on behalf of an existing licensed dealer.

Start Own Operation

Step 2: Apply for Licenses (in this order)

- a. DOH license
- b. WDFW
- c. DNR ROE Permit

Step 3: Prepare Your Documents

- a. Create shellstock tags.
- b. Create harvest & sales record.
- c. Clean your boat and vessels (your boat and vessels must be inspected by DOH).
- d. Call DOH inspector to schedule your pre-operational inspection. These will be done at the Tokeland Marina.

Step 4: Pass the pre-operational inspection

Step 5: Receive your DOH license

Step 6: Prepare for Harvesting

- a. Clean your equipment (shovels, buckets, etc.).
- b. Clean your boat and vessels.
- c. DOH license, harvest site certificate, and shellstock tags ready for review by DOH/WDFW.
- d. Check with WDFW when the fishery will open.

Step 7: Harvest Razor clams!

- a. Harvest clams and place into a clean container.
- b. Fill out a shellstock tag to accompany the clams.
- c. Fill out harvest record stating the date of harvest and quantity of Razor clams harvested.

Step 8: Sell Razor clams

- a. If transporting from landing site to off-site location to sell MUST obtain WDFW Transportation Ticket.
- b. Complete a transaction record to go with the tagged clams.
- c. Document on your sales record who the clams were sold to.
- d. Sign completed fish ticket. The buyer purchasing the clams is responsible for completing and submitting the fish ticket.

Work on Behalf of a Licensed Dealer

Step 2: Apply for Licenses (in this order)

- a. <u>WDFW</u>
- b. DNR ROE Permit

Step 3: Prepare for Harvesting

- a. Clean your equipment (including shovels, buckets, etc.)
- b. Clean your boat and vessels (your boat and vessels must be inspected by DOH).
- c. Check with your sponsor when you will be harvesting and get your documents (license, harvest site certificate, tags).

Step 4: Harvest Razor clams!

- d. If transporting from landing site to offsite location to sell – MUST obtain WDFW Transportation Ticket.
- e. Harvest clams and place into a clean container.
- f. Fill out a shellstock tag to accompany the clams.
- g. Take the clams to your sponsor OR who they told you to sell to.
