Safe Medication Return is Washington's state-regulated system for disposing of unwanted household medication, including pet medication.

Safe Medication Return is managed by two companies, Inmar Intelligence and MED-Project.

These independently operated programs:

- Accept and exclude products as required by state law
- Manage drop-off kiosks throughout the state
- Offer free, pre-addressed, prepaid medication mail back supplies
- Collectively manage the website and the toll-free number

Safe Medication Return accepts all over-the-counter and prescription medications unless listed below.

Not accepted

- Illegal drugs
- Vitamins, minerals, and supplements
- Herbal-based and homeopathic remedies
- Cannabis products
- Personal care products like toothpaste or sunscreen
- Medical devices that do not contain medication
- Exposed needles or sharps
- Business-generated pharmaceutical waste

Medication Return Tips

- Liquid medication, inhalers, gels, patches, and ointments should be in their original containers.
- Pills, capsules, tablets, and powders can be mixed in an original container or sealed bag.
- Medical devices that contain medication are accepted.
- Medical devices that include a needle, such as an autoinjector or securely capped syringe, cannot be disposed of it at drop-off kiosks. They should be returned using injector mailers.
