At A Glance

Fund Balance: \$1,006,000

• Decreased \$314,000

Revenue: \$108,000

Applications: 83 (-13%)

• Renewals: 1,584 (-1%)

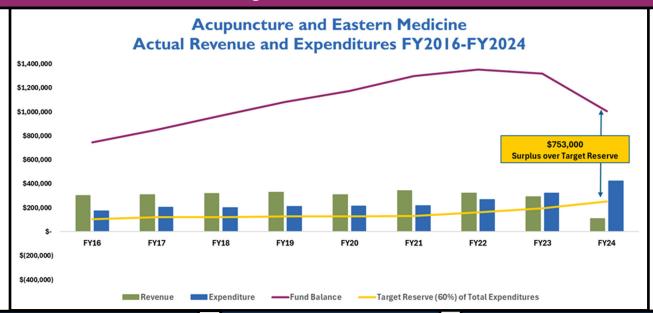
Expenditures: \$423,000

Significant Highlights

- Revenue declined per the 2023 fee decrease.
- Overall, costs increased by 31% primarily due to shifts in program staff time and higher than anticipated legal, adjudicative, and attorney general activity.

Revenue Projections

- Annual application growth: 1%
- Annual average renewal rate: 93%

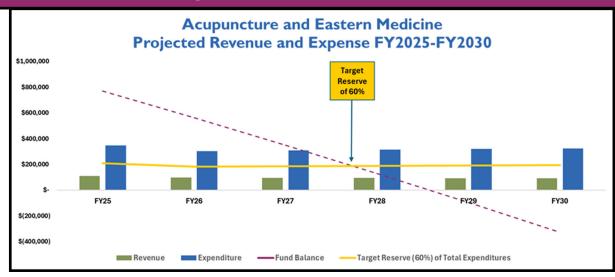
Cost Projections

- Average annual cost: \$318,000
- Expense growth rate in FY2025: -17%
- Subsequent growth: -13% in FY2026 then 2% annually driven by inflation, personnelrelated expenses, and disciplinary costs.

Fee Activity Projections

- The department reduced fees in FY2023 to lower the surplus to the target reserve of 60%.
- The fund is projected to drop below target fund levels by FY2028, leading to a possible fee increase in 3+ years.
