- 1. CALL TO ORDER Dr. Sonia Pal, Chair
 - 1.1. Introduction of attendees.
 - Ms. Einert introduces all present committee members and staff.
 - 1.2. Approval of agenda.

2. CHAPTER 246-815 WAC; CHAPTER 246-817 WAC DENTIST AND DENTAL HYGIENIST COMPACT

2.1. The committee may begin rule work.

- Ms. Gardner referenced RCW 18.33.020 and emphasized that state participation in the compact requires enacting rules consistent with the model compact. She reviewed the draft rule language, noting it maintains compact privilege standards and assigns fee authority to the Secretary.
- Ms. Roner-Reiter provided an update on the Compact Commission's progress.
 The executive board is still being assembled, but a rulemaking committee has
 been formed, with the first meeting scheduled for May 1, 2025. A key topic will
 be defining clinical competency.
- Mr. Bronoske, Jr., clarified that the rules will mirror those established by the commission and reaffirmed that the Secretary retains authority over fees.

3. CHAPTER 246-814 WAC ACCESS TO DENTAL CARE FOR CHILDREN

- 3.1. The committee may begin rule work.
 - Ms. Einert provided an overview of the petition filed on July 3, 2024, which proposed updates to WAC 246-814-020 to include Silver Diamine Fluoride (SDF) use in school settings by dental hygienists and dental assistants.
 - Dr. Gressell supported the use of SDF, stating the importance of parental consent.
 - Ms. Roderick described her experience in school-based programs. She
 highlighted the high usage and importance of SDF in Eastern Washington due to
 underutilized dental services.
 - Dr. Rayna Strong, a school dentist, confirmed regular use of SDF, in combination with X-rays for diagnosing interproximal decay. She shared her clinical judgment for avoiding SDF in aesthetic areas unless medically necessary.
 - Ms. Einert stated that on October 2, 2024, the Department received a request from the Health Care Authority (HCA) regarding the removal of subsection (6) in WAC 246-814-030.
 - Dr. Pal suggests modifying language to require participation only where coalitions exist.
 - Ms. Nossa supports removing this requirement, emphasizing real-world challenges in underserved communities where clinical access is poor, but school outreach is effective.
 - Dr. Sarah Vander Beek, Dental Director, HCA, shares that no agency tracks oral health coalitions, making it impractical to mandate.
 - Ms. Roderick agrees that mandates can be burdensome, especially in geographically remote areas.
 - Dr. Pal confirms committee consensus to remove subsection (6) and reiterates the intent in subsection (5).
 - Dr. Strong advocates for better collaboration between school programs and outreach groups to ensure children's dental needs are met.
