Notification of Environmental Justice Assessment on the Source Water Protection Local Assistance Grant Program

May 5, 2025

WHAT

The Department of Health (DOH) is conducting an Environmental Justice Assessment on the Source Water Protection Local Assistance Grant Program. This grant provides financial assistance to help public water systems protect drinking water through activities such as reducing contamination or supporting water supply.

The purpose of an environmental justice assessment is to identify:

- Who might be most impacted by this grant program
- The environmental benefits, harms, and health impacts of the grant
- Ways to minimize or eliminate negative environmental impacts
- How to equitably distribute positive environmental impacts.

WHY

Water systems must provide safe and reliable sources of drinking water. Source water protection means proactively keeping water clean, safe, and reliable, rather than waiting until the water becomes polluted or a well runs dry. The Source Water Protection Local Assistance Grant gives funding for these projects.

We would like more water systems to use our grant to protect source water. We are reviewing and updating our grant guidelines and are seeking feedback on our program priorities to ensure funding is directed to communities most impacted by water quality and quantity concerns.

WHO

We are trying to reach people served by public water systems that may have problems with their drinking water supply. We are specifically interested in hearing from communities that experience existing or systematic inequities, including but not limited to tribes; communities of color, low-income or rural communities; migrant workers, those who have chronic health conditions or sensitivities, or anyone else who may have concerns about their drinking water.

We are also interested in hearing from public water systems, local governments, nonprofit organizations, conservation groups, and tribal entities that operate or work with water systems experiencing contamination concerns, declining aquifers, climate change impacts, drought, or growth demands,

May 2025	EJA Notification	Feedback opportunities announced via GovDelivery List and website.
May - July 2025	Community Engagement	Gather feedback about source water protection priorities, funding opportunities, and grant guidelines through online surveys and listening sessions.
June 2025	Tribal Engagement	Gather input from tribal leaders about source water protection priorities and grant guidelines through tribal listening sessions.
August 2025	Draft Guidelines	Draft source water protection grant guidelines published.
August – Sept 2025	Public Comment	Public comment opportunities on draft grant guidelines.
Fall 2025	Final Guidelines	Environmental Justice Assessment and final grant guidelines are published to website.
