Greetings Honorable Tribal Leaders, Partners, and Professionals:

In accordance with chapter <u>43.376 RCW</u>, the <u>Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989</u>, and <u>DOH Consultation and Collaboration Procedure</u>, we are providing information on the <u>2025 State</u> <u>Revolving Fund Construction Projects Intended Use Plan</u>.

This plan outlines the distribution of <u>Drinking Water State Revolving Fund</u> for construction, planning projects, technical assistance, and program administration. The Intended Use Plan also highlights the continuing short- and long-term goals of the program. Tribes are eligible for funding under this program and may qualify for loan principal forgiveness for the implementation of proposed projects.

By submitting this plan, we are required by law to hold a 30-day public comment period, which ends on **June 4**, 2025.
