Department of Health/State Board of Health Rule Report May 1-15, 2025

The following Department of Health (WA-DOH) and State Board of Health (SBOH) rules and documents were filed with the Washington State's Code Reviser Office May 1-15, 2025. If you have any questions about the documents, please contact the person on the forms.

Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101)

No filings.

Proposed Rules (CR-102)

Pharmacy Uniform Facility Enforcement Framework. The Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission proposes adding a new section, WAC 246-945-007, to implement a uniform process for fining pharmacies in alignment with Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5271 (chapter 121, Laws of 2024). The rule outlines enforcement actions related to repeated violations and establishes fines scaled to severity and operation size. Filed as WSR 25-10-089.

Expedited Rulemaking (CR-105)

No filings.

Adopted Rules (CR-103P)

Indian Health Attestation for Psychiatric Hospitals, Residential Treatment Facilities (RTF), and Behavioral Health Agencies (BHA). WA DOH adopted new and amended rules in WAC 246-322, 246-337, and 246-341 to establish administrative fees for attestations that a tribal RTF or tribal private psychiatric hospital meets state minimum standards for licensure, and to align those fees with proposed attestation fees for tribal BHAs. The amended rules also clarify that the standard licensure process does not apply to tribes seeking licensure via attestation. Filed as WSR 25-11-050.

Licensed Counselor and Therapist Credentialing and Practice Standards. WA DOH adopted rules in chapter 246-809 WAC to streamline the licensure process for mental health counselors, marriage and family therapists, and social workers. Changes include updates to education, supervision, and credentialing standards, as well as reducing barriers for associate-level and out-of-state applicants. Filed as <u>WSR 25-11-019</u>.

Radionuclide Air Emissions – Update to National Standards. WA DOH amended WAC 246-247-035 to adopt the 2025 federal regulations by reference. This amendment makes no changes to any requirements previously adopted but is required for WA DOH to receive delegation of the Radionuclide Air Emissions Program from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Filed as WSR 25-11-002.

Emergency Rules (CR-103E)

Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act (EMTALA) for Hospitals. WA DOH adopted emergency rules amending WAC 246-320-281 to maintain access to emergency care, including abortion services, while permanent rulemaking is in progress. These emergency rules align with newly enacted ESSB 5557 (chapter 182, Laws of 2025) and preserve protections for emergency medical care. Filed as WSR 25-11-018.

Music Therapist Advisory Committee – Revised 2025 schedule of regular meetings. Filed as WSR 25-11-048.

Washington Medical Commission – Notice of adoption of interpretive statement INS2025-01, "Qualified Physician Under Optometry Law", interpreting qualifications for physicians licensed under chapter 18.71 RCW for purposes of chapter 18.53 RCW, as amended by ESSB 5389 (chapter 400, Laws of 2023). Effective May 9, 2025. Filed as WSR 25-11-037.
