

CEDAR RIVER CLINICS PROFILE 2024

Cedar River Clinics receives funding devoted solely to sexual and reproductive health and related preventive health services with a focus on low-income and uninsured persons. Funding supports a variety of services, including FDA– approved birth control, STI/HIV testing, breast and pelvic exams, Pap smears and other cancer screenings, pregnancy testing and counseling, achieving pregnancy, and pre-pregnancy health. Cedar River Clinics works with Washington State Department of Health to assure quality and affordable sexual and reproductive health services at their clinics in King and Pierce Counties and their satellite clinic in Yakima County.

In 2024, Cedar River Clinics served 3,516 clients during 3,924 clinic visits, representing a 19% increase in clients and a 24% increase in clinic visits from 2023. Across the state, an estimated 72% of female clients of reproductive age served in 2024 were on some form of contraceptive method, resulting in a lower risk of unintended pregnancy, unplanned births, and abortions.

Sexual & reproductive health services provided by Cedar River Clinics prevented an estimated* 730 unintended pregnancies and 250 abortions, and saved over \$3.5 million in health care costs in 2023 alone.

Cedar River Clinics' sexual & reproductive health services averted unwanted reproductive health outcomes and saved healthcare-related expenses by providing contraceptive services, testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, and prevention against certain cancers, like breast and cervical cancer. Most notably, in 2023 the agency's services prevented an estimated 730 unintended pregnancies, 340 unplanned births, and 250 abortions resulting in net savings of more than \$3.5 million associated with maternal and birth-related care, miscarriages, ectopic pregnancies, and abortions averted.
