# Division of Environmental Public Health

The Environmental Public Health Division supports the Department's mission by working with local governments and other agencies in the areas of:

- Safe drinking water
- Food safety
- Shellfish protection
- Radiation safety
- Wastewater management
- Pesticide exposures
- Vector borne disease
- General environmental health and safety issues
- Health risk assessments

# EPH Budget Overview

- Federal
  - Dedicated funding
- State
  - State General Fund
  - Dedicated
    - Foundational Public Health
    - Model Toxics Control Act
    - Climate Commitment Act
    - Capital Budget
- Fees
  - Current rule making



# Fiscal Drivers

- Known
  - Reductions of General Fund State funding, including Foundational Public Health Services funding
  - Delayed and reduced Federal funding
  - Fund balance reserve amounts set by Washington State Office of Financial Management
  - Cost-of-living adjustments
  - Job classification adjustments
  - Costs for Service
- Unknown/Future
  - Additional reductions (Federal and State)
  - Increased programmatic costs (example: travel and IT systems)
  - Inflation

# Adjusting Fees to Maintain Services

- Our commitment to delivering essential services and safeguarding public health remains our top priority, particularly in maintaining environmental public health services.
- The entire Department of Health is experiencing funding reductions and increased expenditures.
- Fee increases are necessary to continue providing timely and effective services.
- Fees will be different levels of adjustment depending on costs, time studies, and independent review.

# EPH Fee Programs

### **Office of Drinking Water**

- Water system evaluations and project reviews and approvals (e.g. sanitary surveys and submittal reviews)
- Certified operator and public water system certification
- Operating permit

### Office of Radiation Protection

- X-ray machine facilities
- Radioactive materials
- Radioactive waste

### Office of Environmental Health & Safety

- Drug lab cleanup
- Water recreation
- Wastewater and Reclaimed water use
- Commercial Shellfish
- Temporary worker housing
- Transient accommodations
- Food safety
