RE: Determination of Reviewability #25-13 – FKC Fort Vancouver

John Rodriguez:

The Department of Health (Department) has completed the review of your request regarding the expansion of home hemodialysis (HHD) training services at Fresenius Kidney Care (FKC) Fort Vancouver in Clark County. The facility and HHD training services would continue to be located at 13118 Northeast 4th Street, Vancouver, [98684] within Clark County.

Below is the information considered, and the facts relied upon by the Certificate of Need (CN) Program in reaching its conclusion regarding your request.

SOURCE INFORMATION CONSIDERED

- Pacific Northwest Renal Services (PNRS) LLC's Determination of Reviewability request DOR25-13 received May 30, 2025
- PNRS's screening response and supplemental information received July 15, 2025
- CN Program's facility file for FKC Fort Vancouver
- Previous Approvals:
 - CN #1484 issued August 16, 2012
 - CN #1731 issued March 30, 2018
 - RA #104 issued December 9, 2020
- Chapter 246-310 WAC
- Chapter 70.38 RCW

Key Facts Considered

- Fresenius Kidney Care Fort Vancouver is located at 13118 NE 4th Street, Vancouver, WA 98684 within the Clark County ESRD Planning Area.
- FKC For Vancouver's CMS Certification Number (CCN): 502522.
- FKC For Vancouver currently operates 24 general in-center hemodialysis stations plus 1 isolation station.

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- FKC For Vancouver currently offers HHD training services.
- Pacific Northwest Renal Services has confirmed that:
 - The project is not for a standalone training program.
 - o The expansion of training services will not result in in-center stations being impacted or taken offline.
 - o The expansion of training services will not reduce in-center capacity.
 - The facility's operations will remain consistent with all prior CN¹ and RA² approvals.

DEPARTMENT ANALYSIS

Current Statutes and Rules

Under RCW 70.38.105(3), persons may not engage in undertakings subject to Certificate of Need review without Department authorization. RCW 70.38.105(4)(a) and RCW 70.38.025(6) define kidney disease treatment centers as reviewable health care facilities.

WAC 246-310-800 through 246-310-830 specifically address kidney dialysis facilities. WAC 246-310-800(10) defines such facilities to include those providing outpatient dialysis and training. WAC 246-310-800(21) defines "training services" as those provided to home dialysis patients, explicitly excluding training space from the facility's station count.

WAC 246-310-812 establishes need forecasting methodology but does not include home training space in station calculations. Past Department determinations have confirmed that expansions to training accommodations, when unrelated to in-center service changes, are not subject to CN review.

Department Evaluation

Because FKC Fort Vancouver is an existing CN-approved kidney disease treatment center, the sole consideration is whether the proposed expansion of HHD training services constitutes a reviewable change. Based on the information provided, the proposed expansion:

- Does not alter FKC Fort Vancouver's capacity;
- Does not alter FKC Fort Vancouver's current operations;
- Is limited to home training accommodations.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, based on the totality of information considered, including a review of Chapter 70. 38 RCW and WAC 246-310, the Department concludes that the proposed expansion of home

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hemodialysis training services at FKC Fort Vancouver is consistent with services already approved at the facility and **does not require Certificate of Need review**.

APPEAL OPTION

This decision may be appealed. You or any person with standing may request an adjudicative proceeding to contest this decision within 28 calendar days from the date of this letter. The notice of appeal must be filed according to the provisions of Revised Code of Washington 34.05 and Washington Administrative Code 246-310-610. A request for an adjudicative proceeding must be received within the 28 days at one of the addresses listed on the following page.
