

Single-use plastic bag ban law details



October 1, 2021 - December 30, 2025

- Single-use Plastic Bags are banned
- Post consumer recycled content and thickness requirements for compliant bags
- Fee of at least 8 cents must be charged and retained by businesses as a taxable sale
 - Fee exemption for customers using food benefits (e.g. EBT, SNAP, WIC)





Bag Ban Changes and Updates



Beginning January 1, 2026

12 cents for plastic, 8 cents for paper

House Bill 1293

January 1, 2026 – December 31, 2027

- Two-year delay in thickness increase
 - 2.25 mil thickness standard continues
- Additional 4-cent penalty to discourage plastic film 4-mil bags

Legislative intent

- Review upcoming bag ban report from Department of Commerce
- Evaluate required bag thickness and bag fees



Single-use Plastic Bag Ban Who is impacted by this law?

- Grocery stores
- Retail establishments
- Restaurants
- Farmer's markets
- Event food vendors

Exemptions:

- Food banks Restrictions do not apply
- Food benefits customers Exempt from the fee

Knives, forks, spoons, chopsticks



Cocktail picks, splash sticks, stirrers, straws



Cold cup lids



Sauce or condiment packets

Pre-packaged single-use utensils are not allowed
