

Childhood vaccines: still recommended, still no-cost

The federal government recently changed its childhood vaccine recommendations. But Washington state is continuing to do what's best for kids. Like many other states, we're following recommendations by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP).



In Washington state, nothing changes:

- Families can still get all childhood vaccinations to protect their children from serious diseases.
- Vaccines are still no-cost for everyone under age 19 through the Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP).
- School requirements haven't changed.

Why? Because the science hasn't changed.
