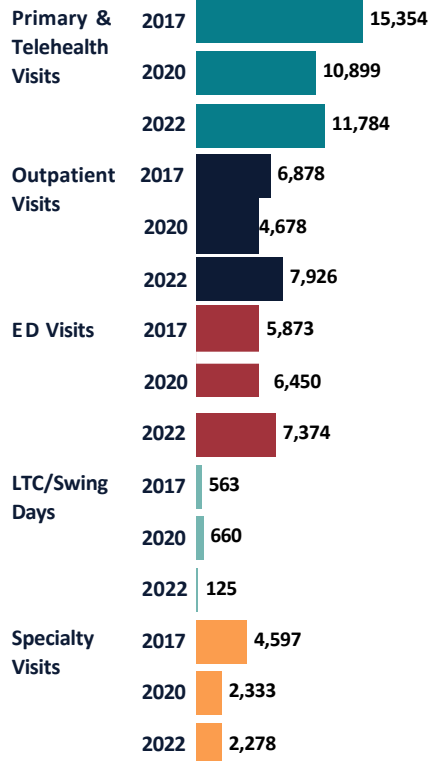

History

Founded in 1934 and established as a Public Hospital District years later, Ocean Beach Hospital and Medical Clinics (OBHMC) has served South Pacific County for over 90 years. In addition to the main hospital, OBHMC operates medical clinics in Ocean Park, Naselle, and Ilwaco. After meeting the federal and state designation requirements in the Washington State Rural Health Plan and the Medicare Conditions of Participation, OBHMC became a Critical Access Hospital in 2002. The hospital is also a 501(c)(3).

OBHMC has worked diligently to develop strong partnerships with its community. In 2000, District residents voted to issue bonds for renovating and expanding the hospital by more than 18,000 sf. The expansion included the emergency department, addition of private areas for admitting and registration, a new laboratory, expansion and modernization of the cardiac rehabilitation center, and moving CT from a portable structure to a space within the hospital.

Today

In 2022, the community approved another bond with over 70% support. This bond was used to add an urgent care center, expand the Ilwaco Clinic and the Wellness and Rehabilitation Center, redesign the hospital's in-patient nursing station and pharmacy, increase access to women's health services at the Ocean Park Clinic, and upgrade various medical, surgical, and diagnostic/treatment equipment.

In 2023, Moody's assigned the district a credit rating of "A1". Moody's defines an A1 rating as subject to low credit risk and cited the district's assessed value growth, strong financial position, strong voter support, and an experienced and stable management team as positive factors supporting its rating.

OBHMC is a member of the Washington Rural Health Collaborative (TRC). TRC exists to support member hospitals to achieve service excellence through collaboration and innovation. OBHMC holds certificates for Level II Cardiac Care, Level III Stroke Care, and Level IV Trauma Care.

Workforce

9.0 budgeted FTEs are unfilled. The most pressing unfilled positions today are Physical Therapists, RNs, LPNs. And CMAs.

Top issues in recruiting include a lack of qualified candidates and a lack of available and affordable local housing.

To support recruitment, Ocean Beach offers an in-house training program for MAs and Lab Assistants and clinical rotations for nursing and medical students.

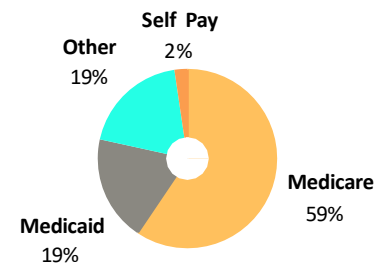
Maternal Health

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Our Community

OBHMC is located in Ilwaco and serves the southwestern portion of Pacific County, including the communities of Chinook, Long Beach, Oysterville, Naselle, Ocean Park, and Seaview. In 2024, OBHMC was one of 13 hospitals across the state to receive a Critical Access Hospital Achievement of Quality Award from the Washington State Hospital Association for its dedication to improvement and commitment to providing care in the community.

The OBHMC service area is growing and aging. The total population grew by almost 17% between 2010 and 2020, with all of the growth concentrated in the 65+ age group. By 2029, the service area is projected to grow an additional 7.4%, with the 65+ cohort expected to be 45% of the total population (compared to just over 20% statewide).

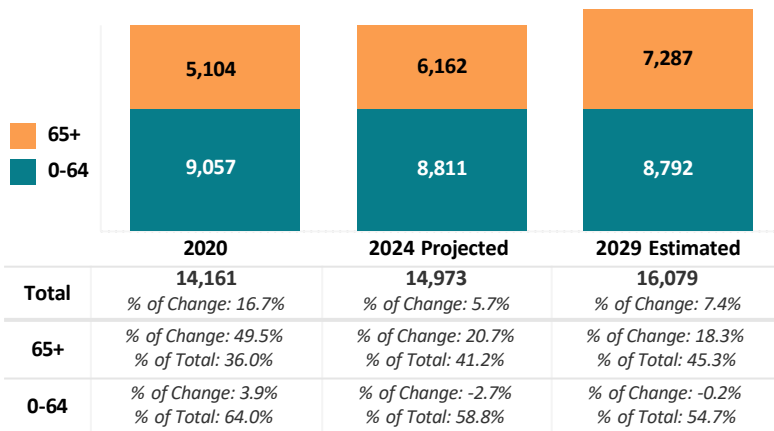


Adults Who Smoke: Adults who report having smoke 100 or more cigarettes in their lifetime and currently smoke every day or some days.

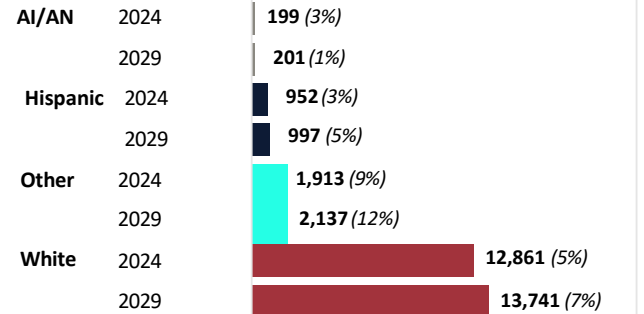
