Rulemaking is divided into three stage



**Pre-proposal

At each stage, there are specific tasks to be completed.

Phase 1 CR-101

Purpose: Describes the issue or issues being addressed in rule

- DOH decides there is a need to write or change rules, files documents with the Office of the Code Reviser
- The scope of the project determines how narrow or broad the rulemaking can be
- Most of rulemaking work is done after the filing the pre-proposal statement of inquiry



We are here

Stakeholder workshops are held to solicit input and learn about the impacts of proposed rules

Phase 2 CR-102

Purpose: Proposed rule language, required analysis available for public comment

- After rule development, stakeholder work is completed, DOH files the draft rule(s) and required analyses under the proposed rulemaking order
- This filing starts the formal review and comment process
- We will not have a planned target date for filing the CR-102 until we have gauged the amount of stakeholder work needed

Phase 3 CR-103

Purpose: Adopting final rules

- Following public hearing and review period, DOH decides if the proposed rules should be changed or adopted as proposed
- If DOH makes substantive changes, another CR-102 must be filed and a 2nd hearing held. If the Department adopts the rules as proposed, the rulemaking order, or CR-103, is filed
