Applications: 794 (+0.6%)

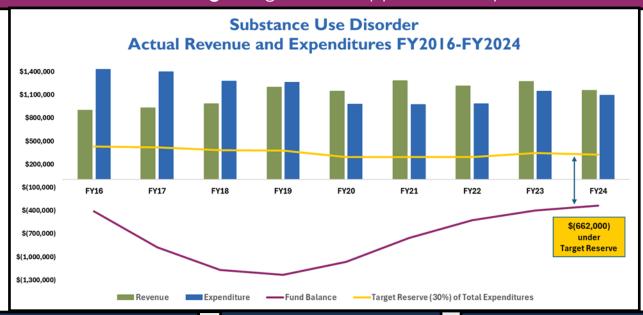
Renewals: 4,030 (-0.1%)

Significant Highlights

- Revenue declined with the adoption of the fee cap for providers and the expiration of GFS funding supporting \$B1311.
- Overall, costs decreased 4% with the FY2023 implementation of SB1311, a decline in HELMS obligations and the use of one-time funding to support credentialing backlogs.
- The program initiated implementation of HB1724 in FY2024, leading to additional legislative, legal, and discipline costs as the program increased consultations with the Attorney General's Office.

Revenue Projections

- Annual application growth: 4%
- Annual average renewal rate: 82%

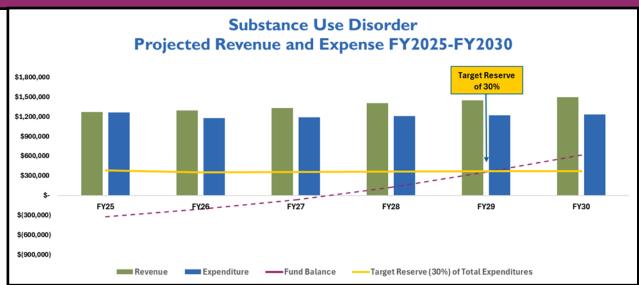
Cost Projections

- Average annual cost: \$1,209,000
- Expense growth rate FY2025: 15%
- Subsequent growth: -7% in FY2026 then 1% annually, driven by inflation, personnelrelated expenses, and disciplinary costs

Fee Activity Projections

- The legislature capped fees July 1, 2024, and will provide GF-S to cover expenditure shortfall.
- Pending funding, the fee cap is valid until July 1, 2029. The department will reassess fees once the fee cap has ended.
