

# Infectious Disease Operations and Assessment June 2014

The Office of Infectious Disease (ID) is comprised of programs that support disease detection, investigation, and control activities in the areas of HIV, sexually transmitted disease (STD), tuberculosis (TB), and hepatitis. Operations and Assessment provides support to the ID programs in the areas of state-level leadership, policy development, fiscal oversight and coordination as well as assessment expertise related to monitoring disease trends, evaluating ID program activities, and analyzing and disseminating data.


### Services

- Provide state-level leadership on ID issues, including policy development
- Develop standards for surveillance, prevention, and service delivery activities
- Lead cross-program collaboration and integration efforts
- Provide cross-program fiscal and administrative support, analysis, and coordination
- Provide connection to national partners
- Collaborate across the agency on issues related to control of infectious disease
- Monitor disease trends of HIV, STD, TB, and hepatitis
- Evaluate effectiveness of HIV, STD, TB, and hepatitis prevention efforts
- Provide technical assistance to local health jurisdictions on disease reporting and investigation issues
- Prepare and disseminate timely data and reports for planning and policy development
