

PrepMod is a web-based software application that manages key aspects of vaccination scheduling and reporting efforts in conjunction with the Washington State Immunization Information System (WAIIS). This includes publicly supplied COVID, Flu, Monkeypox and Pediatric vaccination products from the Washington State Department of Health's (DOH) <u>Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP)</u> and <u>Adult Vaccination</u> <u>Bridge Program (Bridge)</u>. The PrepMod application is designed specifically for community-based agencies and organizations that <u>do not</u> have an existing electronic health record (EHR) interface or data exchange connection to the WAIIS.

PrepMod supports the administration of publicly provided vaccinations, ideally in events where multiple patients are vaccinated the same time, often outside of the traditional health care setting.

## Who can participate?

Organizations currently enrolled in the CVP or AVP-Bridge program that do not have an existing EHR interface to WAIIS.

Effective 11/1/2023, all current PrepMod organizations must be enrolled in either the CVP or AVP-Bridge program for continued use of the system. All sites must complete the training requirements listed on page two.

- <u>Existing and Previously Active PrepMod organizations</u> meeting requirements for continued use, must coordinate with the PrepMod support team for up-to-date program & training requirements prior to using the new Childhood clinic type.
- <u>New organizations</u> who have not previously used PrepMod must be enrolled in the CVP or AVP-Bridge programs and have an <u>WAIIS Information Sharing Agreement</u> approved prior to use of the system.

PrepMod support staff at the Washington State Department of Health are available to discuss further details including training requirements.

## PrepMod Training Requirements

Listed below are the training requirements for all PrepMod providers, including existing sites. This will ensure designated CVP venue admins understand new system functionality and data reporting requirements.

- 1. PrepMod Overview Training
  - Understanding new clinic types & system functionality
  - Managing VFC inventory and item types
  - New Program eligibility & funding codes
- 2. Venue Admin Training Guide Review. Self-Directed Training. Each organization must demonstrate the following steps have been completed and reviewed on the PrepMod Test Site
  - Create COVID combined and Childhood Clinic
  - Manage and add inventory, funding type and correct item types
  - Vaccinate patients, document vaccinators(s) choose eligibility codes
  - Save and submit functionality
- 3. Data Quality Training. PrepMod organizations are required to review and meet designated data quality standards
  - Understanding the Provider Detail Error Report Addressing HL7 messaging warnings and errors
  - Managing the PrepMod data transfer tab
  - Overview of DOH IIS data quality improvement protocols, standards and follow up training requirements

## PrepMod User and Provider Inactivation Process

- In alignment with our Information Sharing Agreement, the PrepMod team will routinely inactivate user accounts of their org that are no longer employed. If you need account inactivation assistance by the PrepMod team please reach out to prepmod@doh.wa.gov
- Organizations that have not sent data via PrepMod within 90 days will be emailed to identify if this site is planning on continuing to use PrepMod for data submissions. Deactivations will occur at the request of the site including all user accounts.
