

Health Care Facility Options for Requesting Health Care Providers

Option 1 – Health Care Practitioner Self-Registration

First, we recommend health care practitioners self-register in the WAserv system at <u>www.WAserv.org</u> to expedite the process for health care facilities to bring them on through the use of <u>Chapter 70.15 RCW</u>.

Practitioners will create a username and password, then follow the steps to register. When asked what organization they would like to join, they should select **COVID-19** - **In/Out State**.

Second, health care facilities should fill out this <u>self-registration template (xlsx)</u> to request approval to practice and facility assignment for the health care practitioners listed. All fields on the template are required. Include all licenses the practitioner has held in all states.

Again, it will expedite the process if health care practitioners are already registered, or are in the process of registering, in the WAserv system.

Facilities should send the completed self-registration template via email to <u>waserv3@doh.wa.gov</u> along with the following information:

- Point of contact for the health care facility
- Organization name
- Address (City, State, ZIP Code)
- Phone number
- Email address

Third, the Department of Health (DOH) will confirm license status with the appropriate credentialing board or commission. Once confirmed, DOH will inform health care practitioners and their requesting facilities they may begin practicing under <u>Chapter 70.15 RCW</u> through the duration of the emergency proclamation.

This entire process should take 24 to 48 hours.

Option 2 – DOH Volunteer Management Completes Registration

Facilities should still fill out the <u>self-registration template (xlsx)</u> to request approval to practice and facility assignment for the health care practitioners listed. All fields on the template are required. Include all licenses the practitioner has held in all states.

Send the completed self-registration template via email to <u>waserv3@doh.wa.gov</u> along with the following information:

- Point of contact for the health care facility
- Organization name
- Address (City, State, ZIP Code)
- Phone number
- Email address

DOH will register all health care practitioners listed in the self-registration template in the WAserv system and process them through the appropriate credentialing board or commission. Once confirmed, DOH will inform health care practitioners and their requesting facilities they may begin practicing under <u>Chapter 70.15 RCW</u> through the duration of the emergency proclamation.

This option could take longer as it requires DOH to receive and input additional data.
