Dear Mr. Fitzgerald:

The Department of Health has completed its review of your exemption request regarding the establishment of an ambulatory surgery facility (ASF) in Tacoma, within Pierce County. For the reasons stated below, the ambulatory surgical facility located at 502 South M Street in Tacoma, Washington and operating exclusively as an ASF on Wednesdays each week does not meet the definition of an ASF requiring a Certificate of Need. The same location will operate exclusively as a clinical practice on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.

Below is the information considered and the facts relied upon by the Department of Health's Certificate of Need Program in reaching its conclusion regarding your project.

## FACTS CONSIDERED

- Proliance Surgeons, Inc. P.S. has been registered with the Washington Secretary of State's office since 1993.
- Proliance Surgeons, Inc. P.S. has been registered with the Department of Revenue since 1994.
- St Marks Micro Surgery Center Inc. has been registered with the Washington Secretary of State's office since 1993.
- St Marks Micro Surgery Center Inc. has been registered with the Department of Revenue since 1995.
- In August 2014, Dr. Andrew Kopstein acquired all of the shares of St Mark's Micro Surgical Center, and merged with his clinical practice, Tacoma Eye Surgeons, PS. Dr. Kopstein received an exemption from Certificate of Need for the facility under DOR 15-38.
- Currently, St Mark's Micro Surgery Center operates a 2-OR exempt surgery center located at 502 South M Street in in Tacoma [98405], within Pierce County. St Mark's Micro Surgery Center Inc. is currently licensed with the Department of Health. [ASF.FS.60433684]
- With this application, Proliance Surgeons, Inc. P.S. intends to purchase the practice and surgical center known as St Mark's Micro Surgery Center from its physician owner Andrew Kopstein, MD. The purchase includes the assets, hiring of the employees, and assuming of its site lease.
- Following the transaction, Dr. Andrew Kopstein will be employed by Proliance Surgeons, Inc., P.S.
- Once purchased, two physicians intend to use the facility. Future owners or employees may have access to the surgery center. A table with specific physician credentialing information and practice association is shown below.

- The procedures proposed at the surgery center include those typically associated with ophthalmology, such as cataracts, eyelid surgery, refractive surgeries, and LASIK. A listing of common procedures was included with the application request.
- The ASF will not be operated as a separate legal entity from the Proliance Surgeons, Inc., P.S. practice.
- Hours of operation for the surgery center are to be Wednesdays from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The clinic will be open from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.
- No management agreement is proposed.

## **CONCLUSION**

Based on the totality of information considered, the department concludes the proposed ASF would be exempt from Certificate of Need review. This exemption is not transferable and the conclusions reached concerning this proposed ASF are based on the facts about this facility and it should not be assumed the department would reach the same conclusion in future exemption requests for other future ASFs.

## CHANGES THAT MAY AFFECT THIS DECISION

If changes are made in the operation or ownership of this proposed ASF, the ASF may no longer be eligible for this exemption. In that case, prior Certificate of Need review and approval or new exemption would be required. Examples of such changes include the following. This list is not intended to be all inclusive.

- Changes in hours or days the site is used exclusively as an ASF.
- The scope of services is expanded to include services subject to Certificate of Need review under the provisions of WAC 246-310-020.
- The number of operating rooms increases.
- The scope of services is expanded beyond the services as identified in the Certificate of Need exemption application.
- The provision of any procedure as identified under WAC 246-310-705(4).
- The ASF is operated under a management agreement.
- The ASF is organized as a separate legal entity from the practice or obtains a separate UBI number from Proliance Surgeons, Inc., P.S.
- The ASF is moved to a different site than identified in the exemption application.
- Use of the ASF is extended to any physician who is not a member/owner or employed by Proliance Surgeons, Inc., P.S.<sup>2</sup>
- Use of the ASF is extended to any physician that is an independent contractor.
- The ASF obtains a new or separate Medicare certification from the clinical practice.
- The ASF ceases operations or relinquishes its Medicare certification and then chooses to resume services as an ASF.
- The ASF or the practice is purchased or leased.
- A joint venture is formed that includes the ASF.
- ASF patients are routinely transferred from the ASF for observation care at one of the area's hospitals.
- Information provided within the ASF license application and future annual updates must be consistent with the information in this determination. The department is aware of a pending change of ownership application [ASF.FS.60779058]. This pending application should be amended to ensure the ORs, specialties, and surgical schedule are consistent with this determination.

## APPEAL OPTION

This decision may be appealed. You or any person with standing may request an adjudicative proceeding to contest this decision within 28 calendar days from the date of this letter. The notice of appeal must be filed according to the provisions of Revised Code of Washington 34.05 and Washington Administrative Code 246-310-610. A request for an adjudicative proceeding must be received within the 28 days at one of the addresses listed on the following page.
