



Proposed Richland opioid treatment program public hearing notice: *Washington State Department of Health asking for public input.*

The purpose of the hearing is for the public to provide comments about the proposed program as part of the licensing process required in state law. This is not an educational event or question-and-answer session.

In response to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) public health emergency, the department will not provide a physical location for this hearing in order to promote social distancing and the safety of the citizens of Washington State. A virtual public hearing, without a physical meeting space, will be held instead.

WHO: Tri-Cities Treatment Center is proposing to establish an opioid treatment program to be located at 1445 Spaulding Avenue, Richland, Washington 99352.

WHAT: Opportunity for the public to provide comments about the proposed opioid treatment program. This public hearing is free and open to the public. Those who cannot join the webinar can submit comments using one of the options below.
