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It is the Examining Board of Psychology's (board) position that the requirement for "face-to-face individual supervision" during psychology internships and preinternships may be fulfilled by virtual supervision during the COVID-19 declared emergency, beginning February 29th, 2020 and ending 180 days after the emergency declaration is lifted.

In response to the Governor's Proclamation <u>20-25 Stay Home - Stay Healthy</u> and subsequent <u>proclamations</u> requiring social distancing to mitigate the public health threat posed by COVID-19; within the board's authority under RCW <u>18.83.070(3)</u> to define circumstances under which supervised experience qualifies a candidate for licensure; and within the board's authority under RCW <u>18.83.050(2)</u> to determine which applicants are eligible for licensing, the board is enforcing supervision requirements in a manner consistent with social distancing standards established by the Governor.

Currently, both psychology internships and preinternships require "face-to-face individual supervision." WAC <u>246-924-053</u> requires at least 2 hours of face-to-face supervision for every 20 hours of preinternship experience, while WAC <u>246-924-056</u> requires at least 2 hours of face-to-face supervision for every 40 hours of internship experience. Additionally, "face-to-face" is defined in WAC <u>246-924-010</u> as "in-person contact in the same physical space not assisted by technology."

Given the social distancing guidelines authorized by the Governor's Stay Home - Stay Healthy proclamations, the board considers internship or preinternship individual supervision to meet

the "face-to-face" requirement if:

- 1. The internship or preinternship individual supervised experience hours took place during the COVID-19 declared emergency, beginning February 29th, 2020 and ending 180 days after the emergency declaration is lifted;
- 2. Virtual supervision was conducted over technology; and
- 3. Virtual supervision satisfied all other requirements as defined in WAC <u>246-924-053</u> or WAC <u>246-924-056</u>.

This policy will remain in effect for all applicants who complete internship or preinternship hours during the COVID-19 declared emergency, beginning February 29th, 2020 and ending 180 days after the emergency declaration is lifted, regardless of when they apply for licensure.
