



Washington Urban County Medicaid Workforce Report Thurston County

Established in 1852, Thurston is the 7th smallest county but the sixth most populous in Washington state covering 722 square miles. It has a population of 290, 536. The city of Olympia is the county seat, state's capitol and largest city in the county. The county falls within the boundaries of the Cascade Pacific Action Alliance Accountable Community of Health (ACH) Region.

Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA)

Areas and populations in Washington are surveyed to determine if a shortage of healthcare providers servicing low-income, disadvantaged populations exists. Areas with these designations receive a score based on factors gathered during a surveying process. These federal designations allow eligible facilities and providers access to numerous federal and state incentive programs. There are three main categories: behavioral health, dental health and primary care.
