## INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths) for the calendar year 1957 and the estimated population for the State of Washington as of July 1, 1957. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Selected mortality data in relation to birthweight are included in a special section. Appendix tables contain tuberculosis morbidity data, marriage and divorce data for the calendar year 1957.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1950 are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.






BIRTH AND DEATH RATES 1915 - 1957

The above estimates of population for the major cities of Washington are based on the State Census Board release of population figures as of April 1, 1957. The population estimates for the counties are independently derived by the Public Health Statistics Section of the State Department of Health.

## LIVEBIRTHS

The number of livebirths in Washington in 1957 was the largest in the state's history with 66,552 births occurring in the state and 65,982 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1957 is 24.3, slightly below the ten year median of 24.4.

Table I lists the number of births from 1915 through 1957 with rates per 1,000 estimated population. These data are presented graphically on pages 2 and 3. It can be observed in general the trend has been upward although a temporary downward trend prevailed during the period from 1920 through 1933. In 1933, the low rate of 12.9 per 1,000 population prevailed. From this point, a gradual rising trend is observed which continues until the peak is reached in 1947. From 1947 to date, the birth rate seems to have tapered off to a norm of around 24 livebirths per 1,000 estimated population.


Counties showing the highest resident birth rates for 1957 (all those over 30.0 per 1,000 population) were Grant 33.3 per 1,000 Island with 36.0 per 1,000. Those counties showing the lowest resident birth rates (all those under 19.0 per 1,000 population) were Douglas with 18.7 per 1,000, Pacific with 18.5 per 1,000 and San Juan with 10.0 livebirths per 1,000 population. Residence and occurrence births for 1957 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 11 of this summary.

Of the total residence livebirths 94.8 per cent were classified as White with 2.4 per cent as Negro, 1.4 per cent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This seems to indicate a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths in

this state. County data by race are given in Table 5 on page 13.

Of the livebirths by residence 99.1 per cent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Residence and occurrence data by place, institutions of birth, are given in Table 7 page 17.

The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 106.6 males per every 100 females. In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 27.9% were the first child in the family, 26.0% the second child and 20.7% the third child born to the family.




The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the graph on the preceding page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 9.

A total of 679 sets of twins were born in 1957. Of these, 644 sets of twins were born in which both were live born and 35 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.

In addition to these six sets of triplets were born. All infants in this group were live born. The county and city break-down of multiple births is given in Table 9 page 21. Median age of mothers in 1957 was 25 years of age. The greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 25.3 per 1,000 resident livebirths and of occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 26.5 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 9, page 21, contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and of occurrence.

Male infants tended to weigh more at birth than female infants.



Median weight of the males was 7 pounds 8 ounces as compared to 7 pounds 4 ounces for the female livebirths. The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 5 1/2 pounds or less at birth, there were 4,501 immature livebirths or 6.8 per cent of the total number of residence livebirths. Table 9, 10 and 11 on pages 21, 23 and 25 give the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 9 through 31 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the 1957.

## MORTALITY

### General

There were 25,140 deaths of Washington residents in 1957, a rate of 9.3 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.4 per 1,000 estimated population for a total number of deaths occurring of 25,407. San Juan County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 13.8 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Benton County with the rate of 4.4 per 1,000 population.


The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1957 was 147.5 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths 52.8 per cent were married at the time of death and only 17.3 were widowers. Female deaths included 34.2 per cent married women and 48.7 per cent widowed. Median age of males dying was 68 and the median age at death of females was 72. The white race accounted for 96.8 per cent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16 and 17, pages 34 through 40 and tables 18 through 28 contain more detailed data.

### Selected Causes

Table 16, page 36 gives selected causes of death for all ages arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary Table

also lists the 16 leading causes of death according to rank. Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.4 per cent of the total number of deaths of Washington residents in 1957 with a rate of 355.6 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918.



Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before that time but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under one year. Table 17, page 38 lists the leading causes of death in each five year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 23, pages 51 to 56.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 26, page 64.

Accidental deaths by leading causes, and by place of accident are given in Table 24, page 57.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 25, page 62.

There were 20 maternal deaths in Washington in 1957. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 28, pages 67 and 68.

FETAL DEATHS  
(Stillbirths)

For purposes of Washington state vital statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 793 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1957 or a ratio of 12.0 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1957, 802 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington or a ratio of 12.1 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios are the same as the previous year.

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 44.8 per cent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 30 on page 72 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 113.5 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratio per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 31 and 32 on pages 73 and 75.

## INFANT DEATHS

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) accounted for 5.3 per cent of the total number of deaths in 1957. The infant death rate was 24.2 per 1,000 livebirths by residence. As can be seen in the graph, page 4, the infant mortality has experienced a steady decline since 1915. Indians again showed the highest infant death rate 76.6 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph below shows 1957 infant death rates by race. Table 32, page 75, gives infant deaths by county and city of residence with rates per 1,000 livebirths.

Of residence infant deaths in 1957, there was a ratio of 145.0 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1956, this ratio was 138.3 males to every 100 females. This represents a male infant death rate for 1957 of 27.7 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 20.4 per 1,000 female livebirths.

The largest percentage (59.4%) of infant deaths occurred under International List group 760 to 776, "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for the greatest number of deaths. Immaturity or some other condition with mention of immaturity accounted for 44.7 per cent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 13.7 per cent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 12.0 percent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in category "Certain diseases of early Infancy").

Accidents caused 3.5 per cent of the infant deaths.



## Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 72.1 of the total resident infant deaths for 1957. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 31 and 32, pages 73 and 75.

## SPECIAL TABLES

The purpose of these special tables which are included this year for the first time is to present selected mortality data in relation to birthweight.

Fetal death data are based on deliveries to women who were residents of the state, involving delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus showed no evidence of life. These fetal death data are the same as included in the preceding portion of this summary.

Mortality data among liveborn infants are not the same as included in preceding tables. In order to present the mortality data in relation to birthweight, it was necessary to match the death certificates with corresponding birth certificates. Only those deaths that could be matched with a birth certificate involving birth in the state to a mother who was a resident of the state at the time of birth are included in these special tables. As a consequence, the rates shown in special table I are slightly defective since all livebirths to residents of the state during 1957 have been used as the base population.

Also introduced in the summary for the first time is material relative to the perinatal mortality rate. This is defined as fetal deaths of 20 weeks gestation or more plus postnatal deaths under 7 days - base population fetal deaths of 20 weeks gestation or more plus total livebirths.

Conventional definitions of infant and neonatal mortality rates have been used. Infant mortality rate - deaths of liveborn infants at under one year of age - base population total livebirths. Neonatal mortality rate - deaths of liveborn infants at under 28 days of age - base population total livebirths.
