



INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths), marriages and divorces, for the calendar years 1962 and 1963 and the estimated population for the State of Washington as of July 1, 1962 and July 1, 1963. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1960 are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.

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
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
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
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BIRTHS AND DEATHS, 1915-1963






BIRTH AND DEATH RATES 1915 - 1963 PER 1,000 POPULATION

PER 1,000 LIVEBIRTHS



LIVE BIRTHS


The number of livebirths occurring in Washington in 1963 was 61,052 and 61,013 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1963 is 20.3, lowest since 1941 rate of 17.0.

Table 2B lists the number of births from 1915 through 1963 with rates per 1,000 estimated population. These data are presented graphically on page XI. It can be observed in general, the trend has been upward although a temporary downward trend prevailed during the period from 1920 through 1933. In 1933, the low rate of 12.9 per 1,000 population prevailed. From this point, a gradual rising trend is observed which continued until the peak is reached in 1947. Since then, the trend remained fairly constant; although, a declining pattern has prevailed for the last few years.

The county showing the highest resident birth rate for 1963 was Island with 29.8 per 1,000 population. The county showing the lowest resident birth rate was Pacific with 12.3 per 1,000 population. Residence and occurrence births for 1963 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 10 of this summary.

Of the total residence livebirths, 93.6 percent were classified as White, with 3.0 percent as Negro, 1.6 percent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This is a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths from 6.0 percent in 1962 to 6.4 percent in 1963. County data by race are given in Table 5, page 12.

Of the livebirths by occurrence, 99.3 percent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Occurrence data by type of institution of birth, are given in Table 7, page 16.



The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 106 males per every 100 females.


In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 28.5% were the first child in the family, 24.5% the second child and 19.3% the third child born to the family. The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the graph on this page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 8.

A total of 601 sets of twins were born in 1963. Of these, 580 sets of twins were born in which both were liveborn and 21 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.

In addition to these, four sets of triplets were born, all of which were liveborn. The county and city breakdown of multiple births is given in Table 9, page 20. Median age of mothers in 1963 was 24 years of age. The greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 45.6 per 1,000 resident livebirths and occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 46.7 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 9, page 20, contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and occurrence.

Median weight of the males was 3,387 grams as compared to 3,271 grams for the female livebirths.



The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 2,500 grams or less at birth, there were 4,098 immature livebirths or 6.7 percent of the total number of residence livebirths. Table 12, page 24, gives the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 8 through 28 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the year 1963.

MORTALITY

General

There were 27,550 deaths of Washington residents in 1963 for a rate of 9.2 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.2 per 1,000 estimated population for a total number of deaths occurring of 27,720. San Juan County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 15.9 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Grant County with the rate of 5.2 per 1,000 population.


The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1963 was 143.3 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths 55.6 percent were married at the time of death and only 17.6 were widowers. Female deaths included 34.3 percent married women and 50.4 percent widowed. Median age of males dying was 69 and the median age at death of females was 74. The white race accounted for 96.7 percent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, pages 31 through 41 and Tables 20 through 30 contain more detailed data.

Selected Causes

Table 16, page 33 gives selected causes of death arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary Table also lists the ten leading causes of death according to rank. Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.9 percent of the total number of deaths of the State residents in 1963 with a rate of 357.1 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918.

Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before 1913, but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

MORTALITY (Cont'd)

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under 1 year.

Table 19, page 39 lists the leading causes of death in each five year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes, are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 25, pages 52 to 57.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 29, page 66.

Accidental deaths by leading causes, and by place of accident are given in Table 26, page 58.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 28, page 64.

There were 10 maternal deaths in Washington in 1963. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 30, pages 68 and 69.

FETAL DEATHS

(Stillbirths)

For purposes of Washington State vital Statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 657 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1963 for a ratio of 10.8 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1963, 660 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington, a ratio of 10.8 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios continue the long term downward trend. (See graph on page XII)

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 43.8 percent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 32 on page 73 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 112.3 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratios per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 33 and 34 on pages 74 and 76.

INFANT DEATHS

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) accounted for 1,339 or 4.9% of the total number of residence deaths in 1963. As can be seen on the graph on page XII, the infant mortality rate has experienced a downward trend since 1915. The 1963 residence infant death rate of 21.9 per 1,000 livebirths extends this trend, as it is the lowest rate ever recorded in Washington.

Of residence infant deaths in 1963, there was a ratio of 139.1 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1962, this ratio was 143.6 males to every 100 females. This represents a male infant death rate for 1963 of 24.8 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 18.9 per 1,000 female livebirths.

In 1963, 793 or 59.2% of the infant deaths were classified in the grouping "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for 588 deaths. These 588 deaths accounted for 43.9 percent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 16.1 percent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 10.2 percent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in the category "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy"). Accidents caused 4.1 percent of the infant deaths.

Indians again showed the highest infant death rate, 62.7 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph below shows infant death rates by race. Table 36, page 80, gives infant deaths by race, by county and city of residence.




Table 37, page 82, gives a detailed breakdown of infant deaths by cause, sex, and age of infant. Table 35, page 78, lists the leading causes for the counties and major cities.

Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 71.6% of the total resident infant deaths for 1963. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 33 and 34, pages 74 and 76.


The number of livebirths occurring in Washington in 1962 was 64,825 and 64,812 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1962 is 22.0, slightly below the ten year median of 24.0.

Counties showing the highest resident birth rates for 1962 (all those over 28.0 per 1,000 population) were Grant with 28.9 per 1,000, Island with 33.2 per 1,000. Those counties showing the lowest resident birth rates (all those under 16.0 per 1,000 population) were Lincoln with 14.6 per 1,000, San Juan with 11.7 per 1,000. Residence and occurrence births for 1962 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 92 of this summary.

Of the total residence livebirths, 94.0 percent were classified as White, with 2.7 percent as Negro, 1.6 percent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This is a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths from 5.9 percent in 1961 to 6.0 percent in 1962. County data by race are given in Table 5, page 94.

Of the livebirths by occurrence, 99.3 percent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Occurrence data by type of institution of birth, are given in Table 7, page 98.

The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 104 males per every 100 females.


In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 27.5% were the first child in the family, 24.8% the second child and 19.7% the third child born to the family. The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the graph on this page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 90.

A total of 671 sets of twins were born in 1962. Of these, 641 sets of twins were born in which both were liveborn and 30 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.

In addition to these, six sets of triplets were born. In five sets of triplets all infants were liveborn. Also, there was a set of quadruplets, all liveborn. The county and city breakdown of multiple births is given in Table 9, page 102. Median age of mothers in 1962 was 24 years of age. The greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 38.3 per 1,000 resident livebirths and occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at a ratio of 39.6 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 8, page 102 contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and occurrence.

Median weight of the males was 3,393 grams as compared to 3,275 grams for the female livebirths.



The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 2,500 grams or less at birth, there were 4,397 immature livebirths or 6.8 percent of the total number of residence livebirths. Table 12, page 106 gives the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 90 through 110 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the year 1962.

MORTALITY


General

There were 27,343 deaths of Washington residents in 1962 for a rate of 9.3 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.4 per 1,000 estimated population for a total number of deaths occurring of 27,693. San Juan County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 15.5 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Grant County with the rate of 5.1 per 1,000 population.

The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1962 was 146.8 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths, 54.4 percent were married at the time of death and only 18.3 were widowers. Female deaths included 33.8 percent married women and 49.6 percent widowed. Median age of males dying was 69 and the median age at death of females was 73. The white race accounted for 96.8 percent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19, pages 113 through 121 and Tables 20 through 30 contain more detailed data.

Selected Causes

Table 16, page 115 gives selected causes of death arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary Table also lists the ten leading causes of death according to rank. Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.3 percent of the total number of deaths of residents in 1962 with a rate of 356.0 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918.

MORTALITY (Cont'd)

Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before 1913, but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under 1 year.

Table 19, page 121 lists the leading causes of death in each five year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes, are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 25, pages 134 to 139.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 29, page 148.

Accidental deaths by leading causes, and by place of accident are given in Table 26, page 140.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 28, page 146.

There were 6 maternal deaths in Washington in 1962. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 30, pages 150 and 151.

FETAL DEATHS
(Stillbirths)

For purposes of Washington State vital statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 704 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1962 for a ratio of 10.9 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1962, 710 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington, a ratio of 11.0 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios continue the long term downward trend. (See graph on page XII)

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 47.9 percent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 32 on page 155 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 118.1 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratios per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 33 and 34 on pages 156 and 158.

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) accounted for 1,476 or 5.4% of the total number of residence deaths in 1962. As can be seen on the graph on page XII, the infant mortality rate has experienced a downward trend since 1915. The 1962 residence infant death rate of 22.8 per 1,000 livebirths extends this trend.

Of residence infant deaths in 1962, there was a ratio of 143.6 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1961, this ratio was 144.9 males to every 100 females. This represents a male infant death rate for 1962 of 26.3 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 19.1 per 1,000 female livebirths.

In 1962, 856 or 58.7% of the infant deaths were classified in the grouping "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for 616 deaths. These 616 deaths accounted for 41.7 percent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 14.0 percent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 13.1 percent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in the category "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy"). Accidents caused 4.5 percent of the infant deaths.

Indians again showed the highest infant death rate, 66.2 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph below shows infant death rates by race. Table 36, page 162, gives infant deaths by race, by county and city of residence.

by Race, 1962



Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 69.6 of the total resident infant deaths for 1962. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 33 and 34, pages 156 and 158.
