REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES FOR VFC AND AFIX SITE VISIT ACTIVITIES JANUARY 4, 2018

Funding Opportunity Invitation

- DOH is accepting applications from local health jurisdictions (LHJs) to serve as regional representatives for specific immunization work (July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019).
- The regional representatives will implement Vaccines for Children (VFC) and Assessment, Feedback, Incentives, eXchange (AFIX) site visit activities in a cross-jurisdictional sharing (CJS) model for the region.
- The nine Accountable Communities of Health (ACH) boundaries were adopted as the VFC/AFIX shared services regions. There will be one regional representative in each region.
- Applicants may propose a different regional configuration in their proposal (with justification and support from all counties in the affected regions)

Relevant Work for Regional Representatives

- Participate in DOH-led trainings
- Conduct VFC compliance site visits to enrolled providers in the region
- Conduct Unannounced Storage and Handling visits to 5% of enrolled providers in the region
- Conduct AFIX visits to 25% of enrolled providers in the region
- Conduct all New Provider Enrollment activities for new providers in the region

Key Expectations of Regional Representative

- Follow DOH established processes and procedures
- Use technology (e.g., laptops, Wi-Fi cards, etc.) on site and fill in the report at the time of the site visit
- Implement the work and not subcontract to other LHJs or entities
- Maintain adequate staff throughout the project period
- Limit number of staff conducting the work to one person per 100 VFC site visits and one person per 50 AFIX visits.
- Be efficient in planning site visit travel; coordinate visits in the same geographic area

Qualifications for Funding

- Any LHJ in the region may apply to be the regional representative
- For multi-county regions, the regional representative must be able to conduct work beyond county boundaries within their region (i.e., cross jurisdictional)
- Meet all expectations and complete all relevant work outlined in the funding invitation
- A commitment to continue as regional representative through December 2020
- Provide a line-item (object-based) budget justification for funding requested
