This proposal eliminates the Miscarriage Management Contract with the University of Washington Family Practice Residency Training program that provides training and technical assistance to family practice residents and primary care clinicians.

The funding being eliminated supports a contract with the University of Washington Family Practice Medical School to provide training and technical assistance to family practice residents and all primary care clinicians for management of miscarriages in a clinic or office setting rather than the emergency or hospital operating room. This reduction eliminates capacity for the training and technical assistance offered under this contract.

Advocates in the medical community may not support this reduction – or desire to find another way to support miscarriage management training and technical assistance for family practice and primary clinicians.

What alternatives were explored by the agency and why was this alternative chosen?

The Department of Health (DOH) used the following process to get to the mandated 15 percent General Fund State Reductions:

- All General Fund State supported programs were put into three tiers:
 - Tier 1 Programs that are 100 percent foundational public health services
 - Tier 2 Programs that are partially foundational public health services and/or directly tied to the Governor's Results Washington measures and/or part of the agency strategic plan
 - Tier 3 All remaining general fund programs
- Tier 2 and Tier 3 programs were scored using the public health criteria matrix, then ranked using the scores and our professional judgment
- Reductions were proposed from the ranked list
- The DOH widely shared our draft reductions both internally and externally to the department and sought feedback

What are the consequences of not adopting or not adopting this package?

Adopting means less awareness of outpatient options for women needing treatment for miscarriage.

What is the relationship, if any, to the state capital budget?

None.

What changes would be required to existing statutes, rules, or contracts, in order to implement the change?

This would require termination of contract with University of Washington School of Medicine.
